**Welcome & Review of Agenda**

**Curriculum Review - Carly Sturm - School TOSA**

Carly described a full balanced literacy program with assessments, minilessons, and individualized feedback. These assessments will better assess a student's needs and create a personalized plan and small group instruction. Areas include: Guided Reading/Text Study, Word Study, and Writing Workshop. Guided Reading and Word Study would be in the Flex class while Writing Workshop would be in their homeroom. The balanced literacy program replaces a publisher's adoption and includes highly reviewed pieces and selective lessons. TOSAs (Teachers on Special Assignment) have created a guide with suggestions for teachers to use with their units. It is a framework but not required to be followed. With Guided Reading, a "Fountas & Pinnell Assessment" is used for scoring and instructional levels. Notice and Note and Signposts take students into a deeper understanding of the reading and higher level of thinking... the "Why?"
