October 27 Registration deadline: September 28; late registration Oct. 14
December 8 Registration deadline: November 2; Late registration Nov. 19

October 6 Registration deadline: September 7; Late registration Sept. 18
November 3 Registration deadline: October 5; Late registration Oct. 16
December 1 Registration deadline: November 2; Late registration Nov. 13

Quest Bridge National College Match – Deadline: September 27

Through the National College Match, high-achieving, low-income students can receive full four-year scholarships to the nation's best colleges, including Stanford, Yale, MIT, Amherst, and Duke. All of the QuestBridge's 39 college partners are committed to making college affordable, and they partner with QB to find outstanding students to join their campus communities. Worth over \$200,000 each.

High School seniors who have excelled in school despite facing financial difficulties are encouraged to apply. You can also be referred by a faculty member.

Who should apply? High school seniors who excel academically and exhibit strong personal character. Typically earning A's in the most challenging courses available.

- Seniors who are in the top 5-10% of their class
- Score >1310 on the SAT or >28 on the ACT
- Come from household earning less than \$65,000 per year (for a typical family of four)
- May be eligible for free or reduced-price lunch
- May be part of the first generation in their family to attend college

WSU REGENTS SCHOLARSHIP PRE-APPLICATION – Deadline: November 30th (student)

- MUST HAVE A SERIOUS INTEREST IN ATTENDING WSU NEXT FALL
- CHS can nominate two (2) seniors for \$4000 per year scholarship
- Must meet the academic/SAT requirement – at least a 3.7 cumulative GPA
- Submit three short answer responses to Mr. Carlson by October 12th at 3:00 p.m.
- If there are more than 2 students who meet the academic requirement and have shown an interest in WSU, the three short answer responses will be the tie-breaker

PLANNING ON GOING TO MONTANA STATE UNIVERSITY? Deadline: November 30

The 2019 Presidential Scholarships at Montana State University is now open for applications. As many as 20 Presidential Scholarships may be awarded. Students with outstanding academic (honors, AP classes) should consider applying. This scholarship comes with a complete tuition waiver.

The application is fully on-line. Requesting letters of recommendation, composing essays, and assembling other application materials require a serious time commitment. Therefore, prospective applicants are encouraged to begin the process as soon as possible. All materials should be submitted by November 30 at 3:00 p.m. MST. If you have questions, contact honors@montana.edu or phone 406-994-4110.

Remember, if you are a College Bound Scholar you need to complete the FAFSA to qualify for the scholarship!! If you are a graduated senior, you have one year to access your CBS-see Mr. Carlson for help with paperwork.
