The next few weeks of school promise to bring many fun and exciting activities to the Windham High School community. They also represent the time of year when we worry the most about the well-being of our students and the decisions that they make. Prom and graduation season often expose our students to risks that may or may not be present during other times of the year. It is important for parents and students to develop a plan for uncomfortable situations that might arise. We all want our students to have a safe and memorable time during this time of celebration.

Listed below are several best practices around celebration events from an organization called Students Against Destructive Decisions:

- Discuss rules: your own rules, the school rules, and the consequences for violating the rules.
- Communicate with your student ahead of time about the agenda for the evening.
- Discuss the evening's curfew and what acceptable after-curfew possibilities there might be (an alcohol- and drug-free post-prom party, inviting friends back home to spend the night under your supervision, etc.)
- Recent studies show that the major source of alcohol for youth is friends and families. Some parents feel that hosting a house party where alcohol is served to minors is safer because they can control it. Allowing these parties is illegal, even with other parents' consent, and the host parents may be held responsible for consequences that result.
- Know who is driving. If your teen is riding in a limo, check the company's policy on allowing alcohol in the vehicle.
- Encourage seat belt use.
- Do not rent hotel rooms, or vacation rental properties.
- Communicate with other parents about plans.
- Wait up for your student to return home.

We can then work to prevent the party from happening, before someone gets hurt or gets into trouble. Let's all work together to keep our kids safe this weekend.

From The Nurse

Meningococcal vaccine requirement for all students that will be seniors in the fall.

Starting in the **2018-2019** school year, all students entering **12th** grade in Maine public and private schools must have proof that they have the age appropriate meningococcal vaccines (MCV4) serogroups A, C, W, and Y. Two doses of MCV4 are required for students entering 12th grade, with a minimum of 8 weeks between dose one and dose two. If the first dose of MCV4 was administered on or after the 16th birthday, a second dose is not required. Proof of immunization must be provided to the nurse before the first day of school.

Dress Code

As warmer weather approaches we encourage students to use sound judgment and reflect respect for themselves and others in dress and grooming. All shorts must have a MINIMUM 5 inch inseam.
