Beginning Opportunities Offered for Student Transition (BOOST) is a parent education outreach to “boost” families with 2- and 3-year-olds in a Montessori learning environment for two to four hours per week. A trained parent educator facilitates weekly classes at B-L Primary School.

Montessori classrooms are offered at B-L Primary School for students in K4 through grade 2. Classrooms are multi-age learning environments designed to help students learn at their own pace supported by teachers certified in the Montessori method.



Panther College provides exploration opportunities for students in grades 3 through 5 at B-L Elementary School. Students have choices for learning about a variety of interests that will prepare them for college and career readiness. Panther College courses are offered to students on a monthly basis.

Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) is a college readiness system that creates a college-going culture for students. AVID is offered at B-L Middle and High Schools to provide academic and social skills needed for success beyond high school.
