

January - Lentils

Brownies made with lentils from the PNW Co-Op in Colfax, WA were the taste test for students on January 10<sup>th</sup> during lunch. You may enjoy this recipe featuring lentils:

### Slow Cooker Lentil Soup

#### Ingredients

- 1 cup dried lentils
- 1 cup each chopped celery, carrots and onion
- 2 cloves garlic
- ½ teaspoon each dried basil and oregano
- ¼ teaspoon each dried thyme and black pepper
- 1 bay leaf
- 32 ounces chicken broth
- 1 cup water
- can stewed tomatoes

#### Directions

In a large crockpot combine the lentils, vegetables, and garlic. Season with basil, thyme, oregano, bay leaf and pepper. Stir in chicken broth and tomatoes. Cover and cook on low for 11 hours. Discard bay leaf before serving.
