

Title I School-Level Parent and Family Engagement Policy

Whittier Elementary School has developed a written Title I parent and family engagement policy with input from Title I parents and family members. It has distributed the policy to parents and family members of Title I students. Hard copies are distributed to all Whittier families in addition to a copy being posted to the school website. Involvement of Parents in the Title I Program

To involve parents and family members in the Title I program at Whittier Elementary School, the following practices have been established:

 - **Student progress is reported to parents four times throughout the school year. In addition parent/teacher conferences are held twice per year. Also, the School Accountability Report Card outlines curriculum use and assessment information. The Single Plan for Student Achievement identifies the school goals and allocated resources related to Title I expenditures.**

To ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school involved, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, each school and local educational agency assisted with Title I, Part A funds, the school has established the following practices:

- Teachers utilize ClassDojo to improve communication and support parents with their child's achievement and social-emotional success.
- c) The school educates teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school; (20 USC 6318 (e)(3))
- Professional development and training is provided to all school employees to support a strong home/school connection.
- d) The school, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate the parent involvement programs and activities with other Federal, State, and local programs, including public preschool programs, and conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, to encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children. - The Parent Teacher Organization works to recruit parent volunteers to support school programs such as field trips, parent nights and festivals.
- Parents are encouraged to participate in classrooms and Title I dollars are utilized to cover the cost of fingerprinting and background checks.

-All school correspondence, including information related to Title I will be translated into Spanish and disseminated to parents via hard copy or posted on the school website.

- Parents may submit comments to the school principal and/or the School Site Council if they are not satisfied with the school plan activities. Parent requests in alignment with our school-wide goals are considered. Requests are granted based on maximum impact, fiscal feasibility and capacity.

- **Accessibility**

Whittier Elementary School, to the extent practicable, provides opportunities for the informed participation of all parents and family members (including parents and family members with limited

English proficiency, parents and family members with disabilities, and parents and family members of migratory students) including providing information and school reports are provided in a format and language that parents understand. (20 USC 6318 (f))

- Whittier works diligently to keep the lines of communication open for all families. All major correspondence is translated into Spanish. In addition the school Parent Liaison provides parent training classes in both English and Spanish to encourage participation. Should a parent require assistance with technology, they can make an appointment and stop by the school office to receive support and the use of a Chromebook.
