


BUS RULES

1. All students must be outside and ready at their assigned stop at least 5 to 7 minutes before their scheduled pick-up. **DO NOT** wait inside the house for the bus to stop.
2. Students must board and leave the bus only at their assigned stops. Getting on and off the bus should be done in an orderly manner.
3. No stops can be made other than those established. Drivers are not permitted to change routes or stops without the approval of the District Transportation Coordinator. Students should be at their stop at least 5 to 7 minutes before their designated pick-up time.
4. The bus driver is in complete charge of the bus at all times. A student who misbehaves may forfeit his/her right to ride the bus.
5. Students should remain seated while the bus is in motion and face forward. No part of the body should be extended outside the bus.
6. Abusive language, spitting, shoving or fighting is prohibited. Students will face disciplinary actions, which may include suspension of riding privileges. Parents will be responsible for transportation to and from school during the period of exclusion.
7. Smoking or chewing tobacco products are forbidden (this includes lighted or unlighted cigarette, cigar, pipe, or other smoking product or material, and smokeless tobacco in any form. Also forbidden are Hookahs, e-cigs, vapor pens, and other electronic smoking devices, which are considered drug paraphernalia.)
8. The possession of laser pointers and attachments and telephone paging devices by students on District buses and vehicles is prohibited. Students may use any personal electronic device to notify emergency response personnel, such as 911, in the event of an emergency.
9. Eating or drinking of any kind is prohibited on the bus.

Audio and Video Monitoring

On September 14, 2015, the Central Cambria School District Board of Directors passed Policy 810.3, which is the use of audio and video monitoring equipment. Staff, students, and parents/guardians should be aware that school buses and school vehicles have cameras monitoring bus passengers. The cameras record sound and video images. Camera recordings are reviewed by school officials for discipline and security purposes, and may be provided to the police or used in school disciplinary proceedings. All bus/school vehicle passengers should understand that their actions and words while on school buses/school vehicles will be recorded and that they should have no expectation of privacy while riding school buses/school vehicles. Riding school buses/school vehicles constitutes consent to audio and video recordings by surveillance cameras. Principals are in complete charge of the daily operation of the buses operating out of their building and have the necessary authority to take steps to maintain safe, orderly conditions at the bus stops or on the buses.
