Course Description: Students will explore the ways sociologists view society and how they study the social world. In addition, students will examine culture, socialization, deviance and the structure and impact of institutions and organizations. Students will also study selected social problems and how change impacts individuals and societies.

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EPSO and CLEP

As part of the district's EPSO initiative this course has been aligned with a CLEP exam which every student may take at the end of the course. This exam, if passed, will grant the student college credit. Sociology has been specifically aligned with the Introductory Sociology CLEP Exam. In order to qualify for this exam, the student must create an account on Modern States and register for the Introductory Sociology course. This course is a series of 10 minute videos about the major topics.

There are no costs other than the CLEP test fee. However, this fee will be waived if the student creates a Modern States account and completes all of the requirements.
