

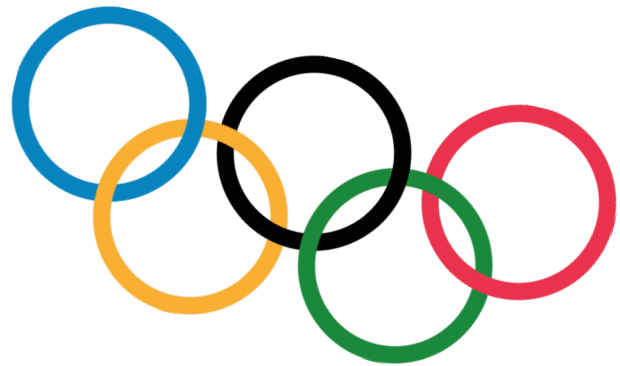
# The Daily Roadrunner

And those were some of the facts our junior roadrunners found on the internet. We hope to see you next time!

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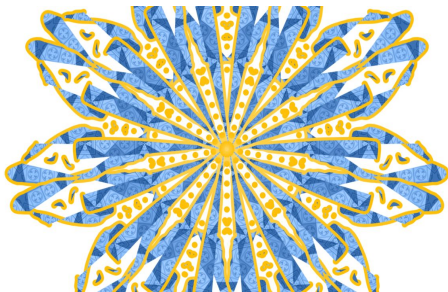
# Elementary Community

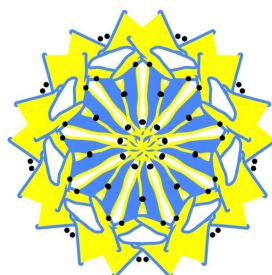
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## Art Corner

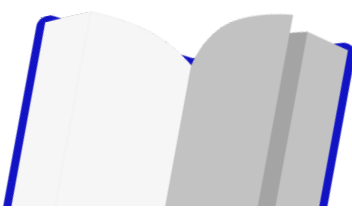
