### Activities to Build Partnerships

**School Site Council (SSC):** The SSC is comprised of parents, students and staff. This council meets the first Tuesday of the month at 6:00 pm in the school library; responsible for revising the Single Plan for Student Achievement and approves proposed expenditures of the categorical funds.

**Chatsworth Charter Leadership Council (CCLC):** The CCLC is comprised of parents, students and staff. This Council meets immediately following the SSC meeting and is responsible for approving all school policies.

**English Learners Advisory Committee (ELAC):** This Committee meets once a month and it makes recommendations to the SSC.

**Coffee with the Principal:** Parents can meet and engage in discussions with the principal, staff, other parents and community members.

**PTSA/Booster Club:** Sponsors a wide range of student and parent activities

### District Goals

### School Goals

**100% Graduation:** Increase the number of students who are on track to graduate from 59% the beginning of the Spring 2018 to 65% the Spring of 2019.

**Mathematics:** Raise SBAC Proficiency level from 36% in 2017 to above 40% by 2019.

**English Language Arts:** Increase proficiency SBAC levels from 66% in the Spring of 2017 to above 70% by 2019

**English Learners:** Increase the reclassification rate by two percentage points from 18% October 2017 to 20% October 2019.

**Social Emotional:** Increase the attendance proficiency rate from 66.9% the 2016-2017 year to 72% or above by 2019.

**School Culture and Climate:** Increase the student response participation rate in the School Experience Survey from 29% in 2018 to 60% in 2019.
