**Academic Team - Mr. Tansey:** Academic Team is offered to 6th, 7th and 8th grade students interested in academic challenges. Students participate in various academic competitions against other schools and within the Barkalow Middle School.

**Circle of Friends - Mrs. McGowan & ?:** This club is open to all 6th, 7th and 8th grade students. It is an inclusive club where students with disabilities and their typical peers can create friendships, develop social skills and fun one afternoon a week.

**Debate Team – Mr. Tansey:** Sponsored by the PTO, this club is open to all grade levels. Debate meets on a weekly basis throughout the school year. Students will debate a variety of topics that are both complex and fun. Barkalow is a founding member of the Jersey Shore Debate League, which holds four interscholastic tournaments per year.

**Drama Club - Mrs. Curatolo & Ms. Colford:** The club is open to all 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students. The Barkalow Players aim to put on a spring musical each year. This club is not just for aspiring actors and actresses. Students interested in backstage activities such as lighting and set design are also encouraged to participate. This club is partially sponsored by the PTO.

**History Club - Mr. Tansey & Mrs. Emma:** History Club is open to 6th, 7th, and 8th graders who are interested in learning more about history and current events. We plan on visiting some local historical landmarks. This club is sponsored by the PTO.

**Maker Club - Mrs. Chapman & Mrs. Seigel:** Sponsored by the PTO, this club is offered to all 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students who are interested in taking recycled materials and creating something new, unique, and useful! Each session will help students to practice their STEAM skills and become more eco- friendly. Maker club will meet once weekly throughout the school year.

**Model United Nations - Mr. Tansey:** This club is designed to engage students in an authentic simulation of the United Nations system by learning about international affairs, the skills of debate, compromise, conflict resolution and negotiation. Students will have fun learning about the workings of world diplomacy through the lens of current events. Membership is open to all grade levels and is sponsored by the PTO.

**Mindfulness Club - Mrs. O'Brien & Mrs. Fischer:** The Mindfulness Club is open to all CTB students and is sponsored by the PTO. Meetings will be held either before school (7:00-7:30) or after school (2:30-3:00) on Mondays. Students will learn the benefits of mindfulness and how to maintain a non-judgemental state of complete awareness of their thoughts, emotions, or experiences on a moment-to-moment basis in order to incorporate into a daily practice.

**Mural Club - Mrs. Greiner:** The Mural club will be open for all 8th grade students to apply and is sponsored by the PTO. In order to apply, students will be required to submit 3 pieces of artwork along with a written statement of why they want to join and how they can contribute to the club. Students will work first with small scale sketches, then once completed, will be projected and painted on walls throughout the building.

**National Junior Honor Society - Ms. Nightingale:** NJHS serves to honor those students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of scholarship, service, leadership, character, and citizenship. Chapter membership not only recognizes students for their accomplishments, but challenges them to develop further through active involvement in school activities and community service. The five main purposes of the NJSH are the following: to create enthusiasm for scholarship; to stimulate a desire to render service; to promote leadership; to encourage responsible citizenship; and to develop character in the students of secondary schools. The NJHS meets once a month throughout the school year.

**Optimist Junior Club - Mrs. Seigel & Mrs. Horvath :** This club was generated to inspire students to spread kindness, empathy and good citizenship through various charitable and fun activities. Being a member of this club will benefit students because they will become socially aware of the issues facing our community. We will meet once a week during the first half of the school year. The club will be open to all Barkalow students and is sponsored by the PTO.

**Peer Leaders - Mrs. Hall & Mrs. Yuzzo:** This group meets one to two times each week and consists of 8<sup>th</sup> grade students who provide a peer-to-peer substance abuse education program. Membership is by an application process conducted in June for the following school year. Members learn information about substance abuse and train in various group-building activities and communication skills before planning their outreach programs. Formal outreaches are then scheduled for the school community.

**STEM Club-LEGO Robotics - Mrs. Fischer & Mrs. Kaltenbach:** This group is sponsored by the PTO and is open to all CTB students. The club meets weekly to work on inquiry-based Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) related activities. The students will design and code EV3 LEGO robots to complete various self-directed challenges.

**Student Council - Ms. Marotta:** The club is open to students in any grade who are interested in developing their leadership and public speaking skills. Student representatives apply for membership during the first week of school after attending an interest meeting. Student representatives whose applications for membership are approved attend a weekly meeting conducted on most Tuesdays before school, report the news to their first block, and demonstrate leadership qualities in every aspect of their school lives. Four elected Executive Board positions are held by eighth grade students each year and elections for these positions occur in the spring for the upcoming year. In addition, other leadership positions within the club for students, such as Speaker of the Council, Sergeant-at-Arms, and Head Representatives are filled by an in-council vote during the fall.

**Volleyball Club - Mrs. Barth:** Sponsored by the PTO, this club is open to all grade and activity levels. The main focus is on executing proper volleyball skills as well as cooperation, teamwork and socialization. Volleyball meets every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from September through November.

**Yearbook - Mrs. Kriete:** This club is open to all grade levels. The club works together to create, design, and sell the Barkalow Middle School Yearbook. A computerized publishing program makes the yearbook state-of-the-art. Yearbook meets once weekly throughout the school year.
