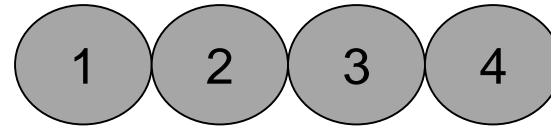

COMMUNITY COLLEGES

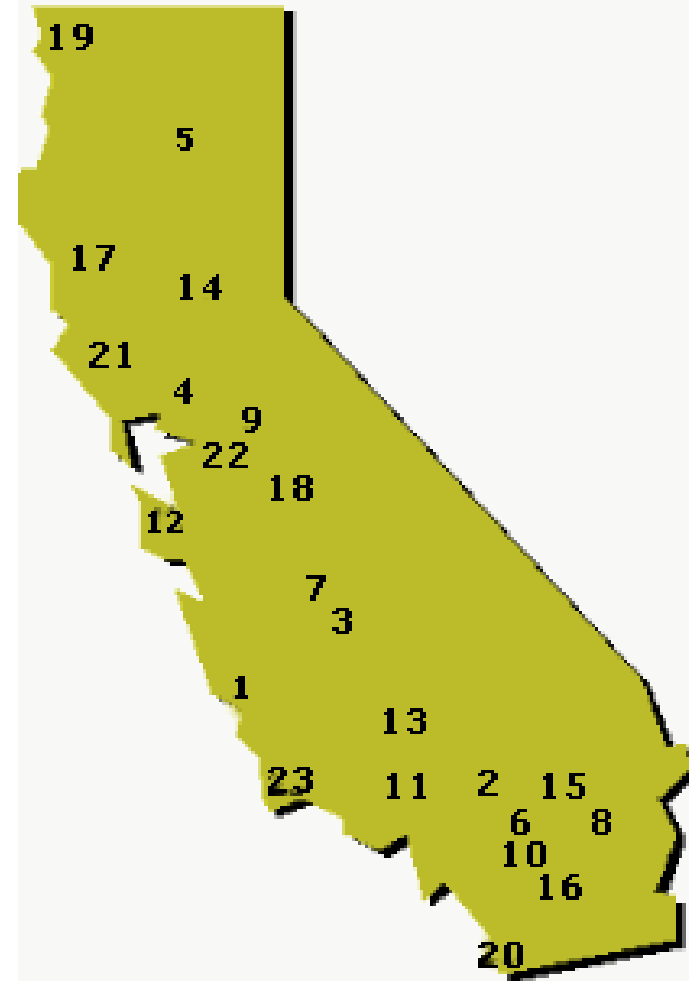


- 112 Statewide
- Receive either AA or certificate (2 year programs)
- Transfer program to 4 year colleges
- No A-G requirements- need only to be 18
- No SAT/ACT required
- Least expensive system
Fees - \$46 per unit; 15 units = \$690 per semester
Books - \$800 (per year)
Approx. Total - \$2180 per year

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITIES



- 23 statewide
- Receive Bachelors or Masters degrees
- Must complete 15 units of academic work (A-G)
- Must take the SAT or ACT
- Average annual tuition & fees \$7,300
- Average total cost \$17,000 to \$27,000



UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA



- 9 campuses statewide
- Receive Bachelors or Masters degrees
- Must complete 15 units of academic work (A-G)
- Must take ACT or SAT
- Average annual tuition & fees \$13,900
- Average total cost \$32,000 to \$35,000

- Over 75 Campuses Statewide
- Receive Bachelors or Masters Degrees
- Admissions requirements vary
- SAT or ACT required; selective schools, SAT II
- Average annual tuition and fees \$32,022
- Average total cost \$42,451 to \$50,470

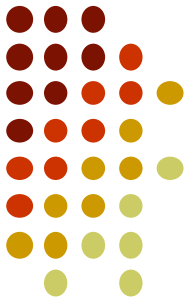

ADMISSIONS CRITERIA



QUANTITATIVE

- Grade Point Average (GPA)
 - Weighted vs. Unweighted
- Rigor
- Trending
- SAT/ACT Test score
 - Super score – take individual component scores from different test dates, and combine for best overall score

QUALITATIVE

- Community Service/Volunteer work
- Clubs
- Sports
- Plays, performances, etc.
- Work

FINANCIAL AID



- The FAFSA is the primary document filed for both federal and state financial aid. It should be completed by March 1st of the student's senior year.
- Cal Grants are another potential form of financial aid.
- National scholarship information is posted on the BBHS website and can be found through search engines such as zinch.com and fastweb.com.
- Our local scholarships are one of the best resources for scholarship monies. Generally scholarship application packets are available in late March.

THE CAREER CENTER



- Information is available on a variety of subjects including: Career exploration, the Military, Vocational Schools, 2 and 4 year colleges and universities, scholarships and financial aid
- College, vocational school, and military representatives are frequently available. Dates and times are announced in the daily bulletin/posted to BBHS website
- The Career Center is open from 7:00 am until 3:00 pm and always during both lunch periods
- Students and/or their parents may make appointments at any time by calling 585-6892 ext. 5223

SAT/ACT COMPARISON



SAT

- Cost: \$64.50 (with Essay)
- Cost: \$47.50 (without Essay)
 - Critical Reading test
200-800
 - Math test 200-800
 - Writing test 2 – 8
- New test date – August

SAT SUBJECT TEST

- Cost: \$26 reg. fee + \$22 each subject test
- Measures students' knowledge in specific subject areas

ACT

- Cost: \$46 (with writing)
- Cost: \$62.50 (without writing)
- Four parts:
 - English 1-36
 - Math 1-36
 - Reading 1-36
 - Science 1-36
- No penalty for guessing
- Science section included
- Consider Score Reports for either test you take



Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE)



- Students who are residents of WICHE states are eligible to request a reduced tuition rate of 150% of resident tuition at participating two- and four-year college programs outside of their home state.
- Many institutions limit the number of new WUE awards each academic year, so apply early!
- 15 States participating

COLLEGE BOUND STUDENT-ATHLETE



- Division I and Division II college athletes only (including NAIA)
- Register during athletes junior year
- Specific required core courses (16)
- Minimum GPA and SAT scores required
 - Following junior year request transcripts to be sent to the Eligibility Center
 - Send SAT scores to code “9999”

College Preparation



9th – 12th Grades

- Find out what courses to take to prepare for college, adjust academic (4 yr. plan) as needed
- Develop strong study habits
- Earn good grades
- Monitor performance and get additional help as needed
- Participate in extra-curricular activities
- Explore post-secondary options (i.e. Career Cruising, visit campuses, college fairs, conversations)

Additional Year-by-Year Preparation



9th Grade

- Participate in academic plan (4-yr. plan) meeting with counselor
- Career research and Occupational Outlook Handbook with Ms. Saderup
- Develop list of extra-curricular activities, community service, and awards received during high school

10th Grade

- PSAT – November
- SAT – May/June (if completed Alg. II/Math III)
- Career interest inventory with Ms. Saderup
- Participate in academic plan (4-yr. plan) meeting with counselor – update plan

Additional Year-by-Year Preparation



11th Grade

- PSAT – Nov.
(utilize College Board BigFuture online resource)
- SAT /ACT, SAT Subject, AP Testing
- Choose 3 to 4 potential colleges – visit campuses over fall, spring, or summer breaks
- Attend college fair - March
- Consider SAT prep class (test preparation)
- Continue research with COIN, College Board, and californiacolleges.edu)
- Community Service

12th Grade

- Community Service
- SAT / ACT, SAT Subject tests – Aug/Oct/Nov/Dec (if needed)
- Apply to colleges: Oct. - January (CHECK WEBSITES)
- Get letters of recommendation (if needed)
- Attend line-by-line in class FAFSA workshop (October)
- Investigate scholarship/grant options (www.chegg.com, www.fastweb.com, Local Scholarships)
- Complete FAFSA: Oct. 1 – March 1
- Finalize decision

THE COLLEGE COUNTDOWN



Oct. 1 – Nov. 30: Apply for admission to CSU and UC

October – January*: Private university admissions

October 1 – March 2*: Apply for financial aid

March 1-31*: Notification for admission

March 1 and on: Financial aid notification

May 1*- Registration deposit due

April - August: Community College admissions;
Housing, orientation, etc.

September*: Tuition payment due

* Check university websites for specific dates!!!
