We are pleased to inform you that the Red Jacket Elementary School will be implementing a meal certification option available to schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs for the 2019-2020 school year.

What does this mean for your child(ren) attending the Red Jacket Elementary?

All students enrolled at the **Red Jacket Elementary School** are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at **no charge** to your household each day of the 2019-2020 school year. **A second breakfast, second lunch, or any a la carte items purchased will require cash or money to be placed on your student's account to cover the purchase.** No further action is required of you. Your child(ren) will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit an application.
