

Required Health Care Forms

Form required for any medication administered during school hours:

- Medication Administration Form (Parental Consent & Doctor's Order)

Additional Health Care Forms

- Self-Administration Medication Form (For Inhalers & EpiPens)
- Medication Administration Parental Indemnity Agreement Form
- Student Health History Form

Forms required for students with the following conditions:

Asthma

If your child requires an inhaler at school for prophylaxis before exercise or for treatment of asthma symptoms, please bring the inhaler to the school nurse or designated trained personnel along with the Asthma Action Plan, Medication Administration Form (contains parental consent and doctor's order), and the Self-Administration Medication Form. These forms must be signed by you and your child's doctor and renewed every year. Your child may carry the inhaler with him/her if they are able to safely self-administer the medication and approval has been obtained from their physician. The Asthma Action Plan is still required when your child carries an inhaler. Your child may require the development of an Individualized Health Care Plan delineating precautions and accommodations for the classroom setting. Please contact the school nurse regarding the need for an Individualized Health Care Plan. **Please select the link below to access the Asthma Action Plan and your child's doctor complete it (Required for all students with Asthma).**

Anaphylaxis

If your child has a severe allergy (e.g., food, environmental, or bee/wasp/ant sting allergy) you need to provide an EpiPen to the school nurse or designated trained personnel along with the Allergy Action Plan, the Medication Administration Form (contains the parental consent and doctor's order), and if applicable the Self-Administration form. These forms must be signed by you and your child's doctor and renewed every year. Your child may require the development of an Individualized Health Care Plan delineating precautions and accommodations for the classroom setting. Please contact the school nurse regarding the need for an Individualized Health Care Plan. **Please select the link below to access the Anaphylaxis Action Plan and have your child's doctor complete it (Required for all students with Severe Allergy/Anaphylaxis).**

Seizures

If your child requires emergency medications to be administered in the event a seizure occurs, please bring the emergency medication to the school nurse or designated trained personnel along with the Seizure Action Plan and Medication Administration Form (contains parental consent and doctor's order). These forms must be signed by you and your child's doctor and renewed every year. Your child may require the development of an Individualized Health Care Plan delineating precautions and accommodations for the classroom setting. Please contact the school nurse regarding the need for an Individualized Health Care Plan. **Please select the link below to access the Seizure Action Plan and have your child's doctor complete it (Required for all students with Seizures/Epilepsy).**
