

Gift to ITJH will honor the late Wayne Page

This year, students at Indian Trail Junior High School will benefit from a generous gift donated by the family of a long-time Addison resident. Wayne Page and his seven siblings grew up in Addison, attending St. Joseph Catholic School and Addison Trail High School. Wayne served in the Marines and was employed by United Airlines for 30 years. He loved children and spent years officiating youth basketball and working with kids to learn teamwork and improve their skills.

Wayne passed away in 2016 after battling cancer and since that time, his family has been holding annual golf outings in order to celebrate his life, raising funds to support local children's organizations.

Since Wayne was an avid sportsman, his siblings decided to use this year's golf proceeds to purchase 40 Polar Heart Monitors for use in Indian Trail's physical education classes. These monitors will help students learn to be proactive with their physical wellbeing, tracking their fitness goals as they progress through their junior high years. The Page family additionally donated \$2000 that will be distributed as grants for use in the physical education department.
