**STUDENT DISCIPLINE BOARD
POLICY 5151**

All students are expected to comply with the rules and regulations, pursue the required course of study, and submit to the authority of the teachers and administrators of the school.

Every pupil must attend school punctually and regularly; conform to the rules and regulations of the school; obey promptly the directions of the teachers and others in authority; observe good order and propriety of deportment; be diligent in study; be respectful to teachers and others in authority; be kind and courteous to school mates; and refrain from the use of profane and vulgar language.

POSITIVE BEHAVIORAL INTERVENTIONS AND SUPPORTS (PBIS)

Students are expected to follow the GGHS code of conduct based on school-wide behavior expectations which are: be an **advocate**, be **respectful**, be **goal-oriented**, take **ownership of your actions**, and possess **self-worth** (ARGOS). Students who exemplify one or more of these characteristics on campus can be rewarded with our ARGOS CASH by faculty and staff members to acknowledge their behavior.

GARDEN GROVE HIGH SCHOOL DRESS CODE

Garden Grove High School is a place of learning where time and effort are invested to support students in achieving academic and personal skills along with life-long success. A person's manner of dress influences their degree of success. The Garden Grove High School Dress Code, given below, establishes the minimum standard for student dress.

We hope all parents and students will want to exceed the indicated minimums. Parents can help their children by monitoring school attire and encouraging them to "dress for success."

In order to maintain the proper student attitude and educational spirit, students must show proper attention to personal cleanliness, health, safety, neatness of appearance, and suitability of clothing for school activities. This code applies to the entire school day. Clothing may not be inappropriately revealing. Students must dress in a presentable manner that is not distracting or disruptive to their classmates or to their instructors.

1. Apparel, hats and accessories shall not contain any obscene or offensive logos, graphics, or hand-written wording depicting weapons, drugs, illicit substances, alcoholic beverages, sexually suggestive topics/ or be deemed gang related.
2. Students may not wear hairnets, bandanas, masks or face coverings.
3. Shirts and blouses must completely cover the torso. Pants, shorts, skirts, etc. must be worn at an appropriate length. All clothing must cover undergarments and all private areas of the body.
4. Students must wear shoes/footwear at all times. Students are not permitted to be barefoot while at school or during a school activity.

DANCE POLICY

School photo ID cards are required to enter all dances. In some cases, guest passes for non-Grove students may be granted with prior administrative approval. All students and approved guests must provide proper ID at all school dances for admittance. Students must be in attendance at school the day of the dance or the day prior when a dance is held on a non-school day.

REQUIREMENTS TO ATTEND DANCES:

- Students must be in good standing to attend dances. This means that all fines must be paid, all detentions or Saturday Schools assigned are being served, and privileges have not been revoked for disciplinary reasons.
- On Campus Dances: All guests must be approved by school administrator. GGHS students must show their current, valid student ID.
- Off Campus Dances: Guests that are under 21 years may attend with PRIOR assistant principal approval. Students wishing to bring guests who are 21 must make an appointment to see the Principal along with their guest in order to have their guest approved. Guests 22 or older are never permitted to attend GGHS dances.

DRESS FOR DANCES

The school dress code is still in effect for dances.

DANCE RULES

- Students must check personal belongings, purses and backpacks at the door.
- Students may leave the dance at any time, but may not return once they have left.
- No Freak dancing or Circle/Acrobatic Dancing.
- Students dancing inappropriately will be asked to leave the dance immediately
- Students asked to leave a dance will not be allowed to attend the next dance.
- Students are expected to follow all school rules while at dances.

TRANSPORTATION AFTER DANCES

- Students must be picked up from the dance within 15 minutes of the scheduled conclusion of the dance.
- School supervision is only provided for 15 minutes following the scheduled conclusion of the dance.
- Students still remaining after that time will not be allowed to attend the next dance.
- Students need to call/arrange pick up before the dance is over if it will take more than 15 minutes for their ride to arrive.

GARDEN GROVE HIGH SCHOOL Discipline Code
2018-2019

Students are expected to demonstrate appropriate behavior at all times while at school. This discipline code is established to provide students and parents information on behavioral expectations and the potential consequences of violating this code.

Discipline will be handled in a progressive and confidential manner. Inquiries concerning discipline should be directed to the assistant principal assigned to the student alphabetically based on the last name or by program.

Concerns or questions about how a situation was handled in the classroom should be discussed first with the classroom teacher by leaving a message with the main office at 663-6115 or email your administrator.

Administrators and Counselors are available to assist students and parents with problems that might arise while at school. Students are encouraged to seek out one of these individuals if they have concerns for their safety while at school.

Students should carry their school identification card (I.D.) with them at all times. It must be presented when requested by a staff member.

ATTENDANCE

TRUANCY

Good attendance is essential for academic success. Excused and unexcused absences are not considered discipline violations but are part of this code in an advisory capacity. Parents and students should make productive use of the interventions provided.

TRUANCY TYPES

Full day truancy, Period truancy

Consequences: Detention, Saturday school, on campus suspension, loss of senior privilege, alternative suspension class, parent contact and/or conference, attendance contract, referral to SARB

TARDY TO CLASS

- Tardy 1-2
- Teacher will meet with student
- Tardy 3
- Detention assigned and parent/guardian notified (this is automatically assigned using FMP)
- Tardy 4
- Parent/Guardian/notified by teacher
- Tardy 5
- Referral to assistant principal (AP) and parent/guardian notified
- Tardy 6 Referral to assistant principal, detention assigned and parent/guardian notified
- Tardy 7 Referral to assistant principal, Saturday School assigned and parent/guardian notified
- Tardy 8 Referral to assistant principal, Saturday School assigned and parent/guardian notified

LEAVING CLASS/CAMPUS WITHOUT TEACHER/OFFICE PERMISSION

Consequences: Detention or Saturday school and parent contact. Loss of Senior Privilege

SENIOR PRIVILEGE

Tardiness in returning from lunch WILL result in loss of Senior Privilege.

CLASS AND/OR CAMPUS DISTURBANCE

Any offense depending on severity can result in detention, Saturday school, suspension, discipline contract, and/or parent conference/contact.

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE/DRUG PARAPHERNALIA, ALCOHOL

Possession and/or use of alcoholic beverages, controlled substances and/or any paraphernalia which is used for the purpose of intoxication such as vaping devices is prohibited.

Possible consequences include: Suspension, counseling referral, parent contact/conference, police involvement as necessary, GGUSD Discipline Committee referral for removal from GGHS as necessary.

DESTRUCTION/THEFT OF PROPERTY AND/OR VANDALISM-INCLUDING GRAFFITI

Any action that falls under the category above can result in Detention, Saturday school, or suspension and parent contact/conference. Depending on severity, referral to GGUSD Discipline Committee for removal from GGHS is possible.

DISRESPECT TO STAFF MEMBER

An offense of disrespect can result in detention, Saturday School, or Suspension. Parents will be contacted.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES/CELL PHONES

However, if they cause a disruption of learning, devices will be confiscated and the privilege of having them at school may be revoked.

- Cell phones may be used before school, during break, lunch and after school

- Cell phones are not to be turned on or displayed during instructional periods unless instructed to do so by a teacher. Items may be confiscated if used inappropriately
- GGHS assumes no responsibility for these items while on campus or when confiscated.
- GGHS Administration will not investigate lost or missing/stolen electronic devices.
- Items are returned at the discretion of the administrator.

FORGERY

Forged note and/or school documents will result in a Saturday school or suspension and parent contact.

DEFIANCE

- Defiance including failure to give proper name, I.D. card, or do as instructed will result in detention, Saturday school or suspension and parent contact.
- Repeated Offenses - Suspension and/or referral to GGUSD Discipline Committee for removal from GGHS.

EXPLOSIVE MATERIALS (firecrackers, etc.) And DESTRUCTIVE DEVICES

- Possession and/or use of an explosive material will result in suspension and referral to GGUSD Discipline Committee for removal from GGHS. Police and/or fire department will be notified.
- Possession of lighters, matches or incendiary devices will result in detention Saturday School, suspension, or parent contact/conference.

FAILURE TO SERVE DENTENTION/SATURDAY SCHOOL

- Failure to serve detention - Additional detention, loss of privileges, Saturday school, parent contact/conference.
- Failure to serve Saturday school - Loss of privileges, Saturday school, on/off campus suspension, parent contact/conference.

FIGHTING

Fighting is not tolerated. Students should seek out a counselor or administrator if they are concerned that they may become involved in a fight.

First Offense - Suspension, parent contact/conference, referral to GGUSD Discipline Committee for removal from GGHS and/or police as necessary.

Additional Offenses - Five-day suspension, parent contact/conference, referral to GGUSD Discipline Committee for removal from GGHS and/or police as necessary.

PHYSICAL/VERBAL THREAT

- To a student - Detention, Saturday school and/or suspension along with parent contact.
Referral to GGUSD Discipline Committee for removal from GGHS and/or police as necessary.
- To a staff member - Suspension, parent contact and possible removal with a drop F. Referral to GGUSD Discipline Committee for removal from GGHS and/or police as necessary.

PROFANITY, OBSCENITY, VULGARITY

- Non-directed- Detention, Saturday school, parent contact/conference.
- Directed at a staff member - Suspension, parent contact/conference.

SKATEBOARDS/SCOOTERS/SKATES

These items are not allowed to be ridden on campus during anytime. If ridden to school, students must be responsible for carrying from class to class without riding it on campus. Students who violate this policy will have the item confiscated and will lose the privilege of riding it to school.

BICYCLES

- Bicycles must be stored in the bike rack. Students are required to use a lock to secure their bicycle.
- Bicycles may not be ridden on campus. GGHS assumes no responsibility for lost or stolen bicycles.

UNSAFE/RECKLESS DRIVING ON CAMPUS

- Any offense: Detention, parent contact/conference. Loss of privilege to bring car/bike/skateboard/scooter on campus.

FAILURE TO PARK IN DESIGNATED STUDENT LOT

Any offense: Saturday school and/or revocation of privilege to drive to school.

BULLYING/HAZING

Any Offense: Detention, parent conference, Saturday School, suspension or referral to GGUSD Discipline Committee for removal from GGHS based on degree and severity.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

Must be considered to be sufficiently severe or offensive to have a negative impact upon academic performance or to create an intimidating, hostile or offensive educational environment.

- Any offense deemed to constitute sexual harassment will result in parent contact/conference, Saturday School, and/or suspension depending on severity of incident. Further, it may involve police contact and/or referral to District Discipline Committee for removal from GGHS.

AID OR ABET IN THE INFLICTION OR ATTEMPTED INFLICTION OF PHYSICAL INJURY TO ANOTHER STUDENT

- Any offense: Parent contact/conference, Saturday School, or suspension based on the situation and progressive discipline record. Possible police contact. May be referred to District Discipline Committee for removal from GGHS based on degree and severity.

HATE/VIOLENCE (causes, attempts to cause, threatens to cause, or participates in an act of hate violence)

- Any offense: Parent conference and suspension. May be referred to District Discipline Committee for removal from GGHS based on degree and severity.

WEAPONS

Possessed, sold, or otherwise furnished any firearm, knife, explosive, or other dangerous object.

- Any Offense: Parent contact/conference, confiscation of the object, suspension, referral to Discipline Committee, Police notification. Must be referred to District Discipline Committee for removal from GGHS for mandatory expulsion offenses.
