

Resources and Information for NHUSD Parents

March 16, 2020

As communicated, Alameda County and six other jurisdictions have been directed to shelter in place for three weeks, through April 6. Below are resources, information, and answers to common questions for parents.

Will schools be open at all during the “shelter in place”?

No, all schools and offices will be closed from Tuesday, March 17, through Monday, April 6. Schools are projected to re-open on Tuesday, April 7.

What is remote learning?

In place of in-class direct instruction, schools and teachers will be providing learning opportunities that provide students with access to learning experiences connected to common core standards. Remote learning is not intended to replicate what happens in our classrooms on a daily basis. I don't have the internet at home, how can I get it?

Comcast is offering two months of free internet to qualifying families beginning Monday, March 16. [Please click here](#) for more information on the Internet Essentials Program. In addition, New Haven Unified is exploring the purchase of “Wi-Fi hotspots” for qualifying families. More information will come out about this at a later date.

Will the district provide lunches and breakfasts for students?

During this current school dismissal period, the New Haven Unified School District will have four (4) sites available throughout the District for NO COST “Grab and Go” breakfasts and lunches for all students. “Grab and Go” locations are: James Logan High, Cesar Chavez Middle, Alvarado Elementary, and Hillview Crest Elementary School from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

To minimize unnecessary trips, students will be given two days’ worth of breakfasts and lunches on Mondays and three days’ worth on Wednesdays. Similar to summer meal programs, students must be present to pick up these meals.

These meals come pre-cooked and will include milk and a fruit or vegetable. These meals need to be refrigerated until used. Families are encouraged to bring a grocery bag or coolers to transport the meals.

Food Distribution on Tuesday, March 17, will be the same as it was on Monday, March 16.
