Coldspring FFA delegates receive national recognition & award

The Coldspring FFA Chapter was recognized and received an award as a two-star chapter in the National Chapter Awards program at the 90th National FFA Convention held in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Eight Coldspring-Oakhurst High School students, two sponsors and a student teacher traveled across seven states to attend the event, making educational stops along the way to learn more about our nation.

The group visited Churchill Downs in Kentucky to learn about the historic Kentucky Derby and what it takes to raise thoroughbred racehorses. Other stops included Memphis and Nashville, Tennessee, and an Amish community and restaurant in Indiana. They even visited the Connor Prairie Museum of Pioneer Life, a living replica of 1800's-era Indiana towns.

"Students were also able to see

the headquarters of the FFA organization by visiting the National FFA Center located in Indianapolis," said Sponsor Belton Rudloff.

During the convention, students heard keynote speeches from former boxing champion Laila Ali, and U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue. Between sessions, they visited the Expo and College Fair, and were able to meet FFA members from as far away as Hawaii, Alaska and Puerto Rico. What a great trip!
