1. Put your students into 5 groups and assign an expectation to each of the groups (Group 1 - Positive, Group 2 - Respectful, Group 3 - In Control, Group 4 - Dependable, Group 5 - Engaged).
2. Ask each group to draw/write examples and non-examples of their expectation in the classroom. For example, what does it look like/sound like to be (positive, respectful, in control, dependable, or engaged) in the classroom?
3. Have students come up with an example to teach/perform to the class.
4. Have students fill in their blank Ram P.R.I.D.E. worksheet as students teach the class on each expectation.
