GENERAL INFORMATION:

The Tennessee Governor's Schools offer intensive learning experiences on postsecondary campuses to selected high school students currently in the 10th or 11th grade. Each Governor's School takes place during the summer at a public university in the state of Tennessee. **Students who would like to participate should obtain application materials from Ms. Ross in Guidance.**

Each Governor's School's application review committee selects the students who are offered admission. Each Governor's School differs in acceptance criteria, program schedule, and participation requirements.

DEADLINE!

Play **CLOSE** attention to the **Application Deadline to Ms. Ross**. Disregard the deadline published on the applications. This allows time to complete required recommendation forms, as well as compiling all other documents needed. Completed applications must be turned in to Ms. Ross in Guidance, by 2:00 PM on the following days:

- TN Governor's School for the Arts: Wednesday, October 31, 2018
- All other TN Governor's Schools: Wednesday, November 7, 2018

A completed application includes the following:

- Applicant Information Form:** Completed by applicant and parent/guardian
- Certification of Application:** Signed by applicant and parent/guardian
- Confidential Teacher Recommendation #1:** Completed and signed by Teacher #1
- Confidential Teacher Recommendation #2:** Completed and signed by Teacher #2

- Governor's School for Arts ONLY:** Verification of submitting online application

Ms. Ross will complete the following:

COST:

All students attending Governor's School will receive a scholarship which covers the cost of tuition, dorms, and meals; however, some Governor's Schools have additional student fees. Refer to each School's application for specific costs.

▪ **Exception:** The Governor's School for the Arts has a program fee of \$2,850 and an activity fee of \$350. Accepted students may be awarded either a full program fee scholarship or a partial program fee scholarship or be permitted to attend with no scholarship.

COLLEGE CREDIT:

Some Governor's Schools award college credit for courses completed during the program, while others do not. The number of college credits offered by specific Governor's Schools will vary. Please refer to the descriptions of each program within the application packet for information regarding whether a specific Governor's School will offer college credit. All students who complete the program will be awarded a certificate of merit signed by the governor.

STATE DISTINCTION:

Students who participate in a Governor's School may be recognized with state distinction if the student also maintains at least a B grade point average.
