<ul> <li>Demonstrates changes in perspective as events unfold</li> <li>Understands complex plot</li> <li>Infers the meaning of objects and symbols</li> <li>Mentally forms categories of related information and revises as new information is learned</li> <li>Follows multiple characters</li> <li>Goes beyond the text to make meaning or search for information</li> <li>Identifies larger themes in text</li> <li>Consistently changes thinking as reading progresses</li> <li>Processes complex dialogue over multiple pages</li> <li>Constructs summaries that are concise and reflective of the important overarching ideas in the text</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>What happened? Why did it happen? What will happen next? Why do you think that?</li> <li>Why do you think the author did?</li> <li>How could the story have had a different outcome?</li> <li>How has (character's name) changed?</li> <li>What influenced the change?</li> <li>What are the larger themes in this text?</li> <li>What is important for me to know in this text?
