“A-G” Subject Requirements

- A. History/Social Science – 2 years required
- B. English – 4 years required
- C. Mathematics – 3 years required, (4 recommended)
- D. Laboratory Science – 2 years required, (3 recommended)
- E. Language other than English – 2 years required, (3 recommended)
- F. Visual and Performing Arts – 1 year
- G. College Preparatory Electives – 1 year

Remember



- 🎃 Must pass A-G courses with a “C” or higher
- 🎃 2 years of a foreign language
- 🎃 1 year of a visual or performing art (*One year* chosen from dance, music, theater or the visual arts.
- 🎃 3 years of college-preparatory Math

TEST REGISTRATION AND PREP

- Four year colleges and universities require the SAT or ACT tests as part of the admissions process.
- Check to see if the colleges you intend to apply to require the written portion
- Come see your counselor first for a fee waiver (if you get free or reduced lunch) before registering online.
- Juniors start taking these tests spring of junior year; summer going into senior year and early fall of senior year.

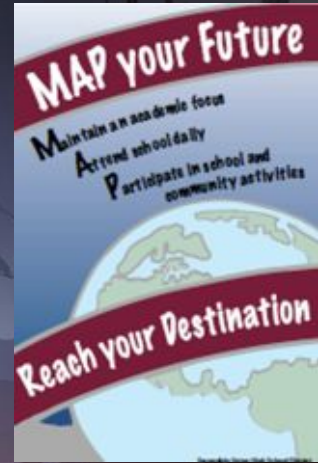

High School Four-Year Plan: High School Graduation and UC/CSU A-G Requirements

UC/CSU “A-G” Requirements*	7 th /8 th Grade	9 th	10 th	11 th	12 th
High School Graduation Requirements: 230 credits A. History/Social Science- 2 years required Two years of history/social science including one year of World History, Cultures or Geography, and one year of US History or one-half year of US History and one-half year of American Government/Civics. High School: 3 years required (30 credits)					
B. English- 4 years required Four years of college preparatory English. Students may only use one year of ESL/ELD English. High School: 4 years required (40 credits)					
C. Mathematics- 3 years required, 4 years recommended Three years of college preparatory mathematics includes topics covered in Elementary Algebra/Algebra 1, Geometry, and Advanced Algebra/Algebra 2. Approved integrated courses may be used to fulfill part or all of this requirement. High School: 2 years required, Algebra or higher (20 credits)					
D. Laboratory Science- 2 years required, 3 years recommended Two years of laboratory science, including two of the three fundamental disciplines of Biology, Chemistry and Physics. This requirement can also be met by completing the latter two years of a 3-year Integrated Science program. High School: 2 years required, Biological (10 credits) & Physical (10 credits)
