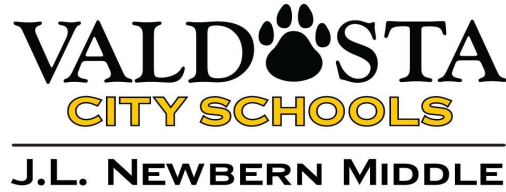

Teachers, Parents, Students- Together for Success

We, at Newbern Middle School, will:

1. provide high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards.
2. conduct four training sessions with parents to instruct them on how they may assist the school in increasing their children's Lexile scores and numeracy skills.
3. show respect for the diversity of all students and their families.
4. provide differentiated instruction that meets the needs of all learners.
5. send home a 4-1/2 week Interim progress report and a Report Card each nine week grading period.
6. participate in parent/guardian conferences to create a home-school collaboration.
7. provide parents reasonable access to staff.
8. provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities.

We, as parents, will:


1. see that my child attends school regularly and is on time.
2. communicate with my child's teachers on a consistent basis.
3. establish a designated study time and assist with homework and test preparation.
4. attend school sponsored events and trainings sessions as often as possible.
5. attend Parent-Teacher conferences and extracurricular activities.
6. be aware of what my child is learning, what is expected of the student, and how my child performs on each assignment using Parent Portal, Interim progress reports, and/or looking through my student's notebooks.

7. make sure my child is reading daily.
8. sign and return all interim progress reports and report cards.

2. demonstrate respect for myself, for others, and my school.
3. maximize learning time by obeying school and bus rules.
4. try to do my best in my academic work and in my behavior.
5. come to school with a positive attitude and prepared to learn.
6. work cooperatively with my classmates, teachers and other school staff.
7. communicate with my parents/guardians about what happens each day and upcoming events at school.
8. understand that reading influences my performance in all classes.
