
The dinner is hosted at noon in the auditorium by a dedicated cadre of volunteers – you could be one of them! Cooks are invited to prepare turkey or side dishes.

Adoration Holy Hour for Church, Country





Like the Christmas story itself, one of the "greatest stories ever told" is that of the Alternative Gift Christmas Market celebrating its 33rd year. The hero of our story is the legendary George Gould, a self-effacing but ardent champion of social justice at OLA. In 1985, he picked up on the "alternative gift" concept from Harriet Prichard of Pasadena Presbyterian Church who demonstrated both passion for the poor and prudence in administering funds. She would go on to found the Alternative Gifts International or AGI, a sponsor for some of the programs available at OLA's market.

The committee soon turned to local organizations with a connection to OLA to populate their shopping list, in addition to AGI. They found Habitat for Humanity in Pomona and Inland Valley Council of Churches (now Hope Partners). But the most compelling stories came from parishioners who have traveled to distant lands and returned to OLA to advocate for people whose need they have experienced firsthand.

These include Joe Domond who leads a medical mission to Haiti, Mike Donahue who is helping the people of Nepal recover from a devastating earthquake, Anita Boling who works with tribes in Tanzania to bring better health, the Lynch-Maldonado Family which represents Hogar de Amistad orphanage, the Philippine Mission advocated by Jose and Meg Gutierrez, the Salesian and Tijuana missions brought by Don and Lena Kho whose son served in those programs, and St. Camillus Center pastored by Fr. Chris Ponnet., formerly of OLA.
