**Graduation Requirements:** Students must earn 220 credits to graduate (five credits per semester for courses completed with a grade of "D" or better).

Credits must include: four years of English, two years of math, two years of science, three and a half years of social science, two years of physical education, one semester of health, and one year from two of the following: foreign language/technical/visual-performing arts. Up to 40 credits of non-district course work can be placed on transcript.

**College Connect** College Connect is a dual-enrollment opportunity for students to enroll in a shortened high school schedule so that they may attend college courses during their 11<sup>th</sup> and 12 grade years. College Connect students can complete up to 30 units of transferable credit aligned with the University of California's (UC) and California State University(CSU) Inter-segmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) requirements. These students have the opportunity to complete their first year of college by the time that they graduate from high school.
