1. 12:11pm - Call to order – Sophie Weinheimer
2. Minutes Approval January without amendments– Motion Deb Rose, Second Anna Harris
3. Old Business:
 - a. Dental Hygiene Program update – Janice Bruno: 2 dental providers from Lakeway will be starting once per month for 100% dental services to public. St. David’s Foundation has granted site visit for possible mobile van. Site visit will be 5/31/18. Van comes with \$10,000 for first year.
 - b. Shoes that Fit Program – Deb Rose: All money from grant was spent except less than \$20 and the rest will be spent in the next couple weeks. Approximately 400 pairs of shoes were given out throughout the year. All campuses also now have reserve on extra shoes and socks.
 - c. WAIT Program – Celeste Hoffman: Abstinence program was completed at Junior High 4/3 and High School 4/2. Per Celeste will personally train a little more with presenters. No other critiques given.
4. New Business:
 - a. Health Fair Update – Sophie Weinheimer & Judy Burgeon: Will be held possibly 6/9/18 at the Smithville Public Library. Entities involved will include: SISD, Community Clinic, Library with a possible round robin format 10 minute sessions with activity or class with each “station”. More information to follow.
 - b. Smithville Clinic Update – Janice Bruno: John Sandoval PA moved to Wednesdays 1pm – 5pm. Barbara Howard, NP will be starting Fridays 10 – 12 patients per day by appointment only (times TBA) for women’s health in June. Dental update as above. Brianna Temby now volunteer coordinator and working with Julie Miller at Seton for coordination of nurses including Christie Otto, RN.
 - c. ANTES (Acanthosis Nigricans) – All schools screened with 30 – 40 at each campus. Only 9th grade screened at high school with 9 identified. Regional/State data will be available at end of June to compare.
 - d. Catch My Breath Program – Cheryl: Will present in September at next SHAC meeting. Prevention of tobacco with focus on vaping and ecig devices. Evidence based curriculum. Free due to a grant from CVS. Geared for the Jr High and High School levels, but can be altered for elementary age.
 - e. Family Connect Program – Anna Harris: New program due to Bastrop County one of 2 highest CPS referral counties in Texas. Will have 2 home care nurses (also lactation consultant certified) performing 250 home visits / nurse / week. Goal is to have a nurse in the home for any baby born in Travis county and brought back to Bastrop County within 3 weeks. Referral program. Can do 3 visits to f/u referrals. MOMS groups will meet 5/21/18 10 – 11am Cedar Creek Methodist and 5/22/18 6-7pm Bastrop Episcopal on Main Street Bastrop. WIC is now in with Lonestar COC Clinic. CASA Fundraiser 6/9/18 6-10pm Bastrop Convention Center.
 - f. Summer Feed Program – Candy Biehle: Last year fed more than 8,000 meals and got the Silver Turnip the Beet Award (1 of 6 in Texas, 1 of 111 in nation). TDA not approving yet – Candy to complete additional documentation needs. Will be 7 – 9 sites. Need for 6 student volunteers for 4 – 6 hours per day and apps will be at the high school. Will be a Kickoff and a July Kickup activity.
 - g. We grow, We Cook, We Eat – Roxanne: Started last year. Cooking once per month with vegetables in community garden. Kids and parents prefer 8 years old and above but flexible. 4th Saturday 1pm Church of Christ.
