

## Student Council needs your help to Change Cancer!

The Knoch Middle School Student Council is sponsoring the **Pennies for Patients Fundraiser for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society**. The fundraiser will run from Monday, February 11th through Friday, March 1. First period classes will compete against each other to see who can collect the most change.

Student should return their collected change to their 1st period teacher in their collection box or a plastic bag labels with their 1st period room number, their name, and amount collected. The classroom that collects the most money will receive a breakfast. Totals will be posted on Monday February 18th, February 25th, and winners will be announced March 1st. Student council volunteers will come to classes on Monday 2/11, Tuesday 2/12, Friday 2/15, Friday 2/22, and Friday 3/1 to collect donations and distribute Scene 75 cards.

The first 50 students to donate \$10 will receive a \$10 arcade card to Scene 75.

The first 75 students to donate \$5 will receive a free laser tag game at Scene 75 (\$8.50 value).

The first 50 students to donate \$2 will receive a \$5 arcade card to Scene 75.

In addition the school will work together for its fundraising goal of \$2,500.

If we raise \$750 we can hit Mrs. Cratty with a pie.

If we raise \$1000 we can hit Mr. Blum with a pie.

If we raise \$1,500 we can hit Mr. Voltz with a pie.
