We follow the Missouri Comprehensive School Counseling Program through the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education to best meet the social/emotional, academic, and career development needs of all students.

School counselors work collaboratively with parents, school professionals, and students to facilitate all students' growth. It is the counselors' responsibility to identify and remove barriers that may impede academic and lifelong achievement. To best meet students' and families' needs, school counselors work to connect students to appropriate resources including an in-district team of school-to-home liaisons and clinical social workers. The team also works together with various community agencies to develop and implement initiatives to support the needs of students.

Counselors in the Camdenton R-III School District participate in ongoing professional development to identify and develop best practices for meeting the needs of today's learners.
