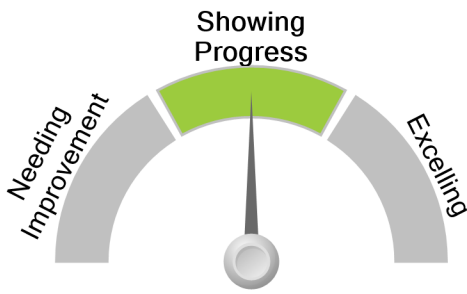

Students meeting/exceeding expectations on state assessment

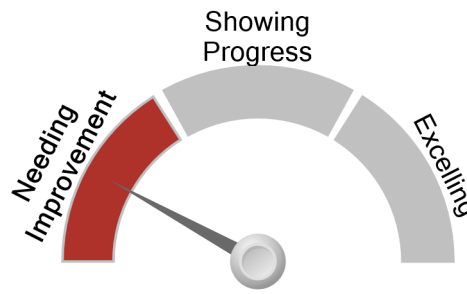

Students meeting/exceeding expectations on state assessment

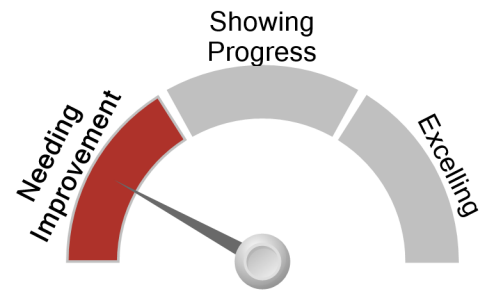

Students absent for 10% or more of days enrolled

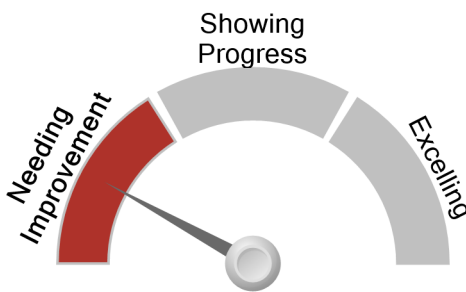
