Dear Sanger ISD Families,

As the health emergency continues to evolve, Superintendents from Denton County met with county health officials through a Zoom meeting this week. As we are all aware, Denton County Judge Andy Eads recently issued a “Stay at Home” Order to help provide social distancing and to stem the tide of the spread of the COVID-19 virus in our county.

Looking at the continued increase in cases being identified, the next few weeks are crucial in our fight for the health of our loved ones.

The Superintendents of Denton County also acknowledge that families need to plan. These are unprecedented times and we want to provide our families as much notice as possible. As stated in a joint press release issued by the school districts in Denton County: “Therefore, in support of the “Stay at Home” Order issued by Denton County Judge Andy Eads, the following schools in Denton County announced they will extend district wide closure through Friday, April 17, including activities on school campuses through Sunday, April 19.

Students, parents and staff of the following districts are urged by their leaders to remain vigilant in their efforts to stay healthy and stay at home.

Schools and offices in these districts are scheduled to reopen on Monday, April 20.

Administrative teams in each district will continue to evaluate the recommendations of the Denton County Public Health (DCPH) department as well as the Center for Disease Control (CDC) to determine whether a longer closure beyond April 17 will be necessary.

“The quicker we properly keep our distance, the quicker the kids can return to school and our lives and business can continue,” said Judge Eads at a recent briefing.

Educate – Inspire - Elevate

Because of the risk of the rapid spread of the virus and the need to protect the most vulnerable members of the community, Denton County residents are asked to stay at home, except for specific essential activities. Residents who work to provide essential business and government services or perform essential public infrastructure are exempt.”

Sanger ISD will continue to provide meals and instructional support during closure as we communicated previously and updated on Friday, March 20, 2020. As a reminder, beginning Monday, March 30, we will be serving our “curbside” pick up lunches at Clear Creek Intermediate. The address for Clear Creek is 1901 S. Stemmons, Sanger, TX 76266. Information pertaining to the lunch delivery service will be released in the next few days.

Thank you for your support during this time. Working together and following the recommendations of our Denton County leadership and the CDC will help us all make it through the health emergency and return our lives and activities back to normal.
