- III. Approval of Minutes
 - a. Minutes from the November 15, 2017, meeting were handed out and approved as presented.
- IV. DELAC Report
 - a. Student attendance was a major point in helping students succeed. King has a 98% attendance rate. This is much higher than all the other schools.
 - b. Suspensions for King had a major decrease between the 15-16 and 16-17 school year. This was primarily due to a change of the Education Code and the rules of suspension. Statistics show that suspensions early in a child's education tend to lead to a future leading towards jail or imprisonment. King's use of PIQE and PATHS programs help to build a positivity and happiness within students.
- V. Business, indicate Action (A), Discussion (D) and/or Information (I)
 - a. **District office property (I)** – Draft of the district's Facility Master Plan (FMP) was reviewed. Main goals were reviewed and questions asked. If approved FMP will be placed on the 2018 ballot as Measure Q.
 - b. **Draft Calendar (I)** – draft calendars for 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 school years passed out and reviewed.
 - c. **Testing Schedule (I)** - copy of the testing schedule was passed out. Discussed the option of an individual family opting out, but also pointed out that the school is penalized if too many decide to do so.
 - d. **English Learner Reclassification (I)** – 10 students will be reclassified as proficient. Still have approximately 80 students designated English Learners. There will be a celebration for the reclassified students and their families. Students will now be taking the ELPAC test instead

of the CELDT test. The ELPAC test is reported to me much more difficult, especially in the writing portion.
