

RICHMOND-PENNOCK FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions)

Who is eligible?

In addition to being a graduate of Garden Spot High School, applicants must be enrolled in or accepted at an accredited college in a pre-professional program with the intention of pursuing dentistry as a career, at an accredited school of dentistry, or in an accredited school for dental hygienist, certified dental assistant, dental laboratory technician or registered nurse.

What do the awards cover?

Awards may be designated to cover tuition, room and board, books or other expenses necessary for the program of study.

How is the money paid?

The money is normally paid directly to the institution that the student is attending.

On what basis are scholarships awarded?

Recipients are initially chosen on the basis of scholastic record, financial need, and interview with the Scholarship Committee.

What selects the recipients?

The trust provides for a committee consisting of the Superintendent and the Assistant to the Superintendent of the Eastern Lancaster County School District and one person nominated by the Trustee.

How much are the awards?

The awards will vary, depending both on the financial need of the recipients and the scholarship monies available.

When are the awards made?

Awards are announced and presented at the spring Senior Awards Ceremonies at the Garden Spot High School.

Can the scholarships be renewed?

Yes. Although awards are made for one academic year, a scholarship may be renewed from year to year, depending upon the academic record maintained, financial need and trust monies available. A renewal application form will have to be submitted each year for scholarship renewal.

How do you qualify?
