

# **Junior High Math Supplies for Summit Academy – Independence**

Every junior high math student will need the following supplies. We are asking that the supplies be given to the math teacher the first week of school, as they will be given out as needed over the course of the year. ## **Supply List**

1. One package of loose leaf lined paper (college ruled)
2. One package or box of pencils (any kind with an eraser)
3. Four black expo whiteboard markers (any size - thin line, standard, etc.)
4. One package of colored paper (any light or bright colors that can be used for photocopies - any weight i.e. copy paper weight or card stock)

## **Optional -**

- 7th and 8th grade Math

Students will need a calculator the entire year in 8th grade math and for part of the year in 7th grade math. Every classroom has a class set of calculators that will be available for student use while at school, however, if you would like the same calculator at home for your student use when working on homework, it can be purchased on Amazon for approximately \$15.00 (see link below). Again, this purchase is optional.

- Secondary 1

8th grade students taking the Secondary 1 class will be using a graphing calculator. Graphing calculators are a large purchase, generally costing over \$100, so when you purchase one, you want it to last through high school and college. The most commonly used one is the TI-84 (see link below). This is the model used in most high schools and can be used on the ACTs. Since it is a large purchase, I would recommend checking with older students who may not be using theirs anymore (older sibling, older cousin, neighbor, etc.). They can also be purchased used on KSL Classifieds for about half price (most were \$50-60). You may even still have yours from your school days! Any graphing calculator will work for our purposes. If this purchase is not in your budget, no worries. We will work something out.
