Minutes of Regular Meeting

April 19, 2012

The Garvey School District Board of Education met in regular session on April 19, 2012, at the Bitley School, Rosemead, California.

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:35 p.m., by Board President Tony Ramos.

ROLL CALL

Present at the meeting were Mr. Bob Bruesch, Ms. M. Janet Chin, Mr. Henry Lo (arrived at 8:34 p.m.), Mr. Tony Ramos, Mr. John Yuen (arrived at 6:41 p.m.), and Superintendent Dr. Sandra Johnson.

Also in attendance were Mr. Genaro Alarcon, Mr. Michael Coughlin, Ms. Dolores Preciado, Dr. Mary Suzuki, and Ms. Maria De La Cruz.

VISITORS PRESENT

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG

Students Jennifer and William led the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

SPECIAL RECOGNITION

Justin Phan, LACOE Spelling Bee, 3rd Place award. Presentation postponed.

COMMUNICATIONS/REPORTS FROM THE BOARD AND SUPERINTENDENT

Dr. Sandra Johnson addressed the financial conditions in the District and recognized that these are very difficult times for everyone in the District and throughout the State with many districts facing similar circumstances.

Michael Coughlin made a Power Point presentation regarding the current status of the District's budget that has led to the submission of a Qualified 2nd Interim report. This means that Garvey may not be able to meet the state requirements for a minimally solvent school district budget in 2013-14. For Fiscal Year 2012-13, Garvey must reduce \$2,130,057 from its budget in 2012-13 and again in 2013-14, per L.A. County Office of Education (LACOE) requirements. The District must also cut \$370 per average daily attendance (ADA) anticipating the Governor's trigger cuts. At the same time, layoff notices to certificated employees have to be made by March 15 and layoff notices to classified employees by May 15. The governor's budget initiatives need to be on the ballot by the end of June to be approved by the voters in November, 2012. Mr. Coughlin stated that the District must plan for the worst case scenario.

Mr. Coughlin explained the reason for the preliminary issuing of 32 layoff notices, a total of 31.1 FTE positions. Aside from these reductions, the District still has to cut nearly an additional \$1.2 million dollars. He talked about the 2013-14 projections as indicated in the 2nd Interim Report. At that time, the budget deficit will be \$4,260,115, not considering additional losses expected in declining enrollment next year that will have an impact on the District's revenue. Dr. Sandra Johnson stated that the Board needs to start looking at the feasibility of a bond election to help in these difficult times.

Dr. Johnson stated that at the last Board meeting she was chastised for not attending the Alhambra Education Foundation dinner. Dr. Johnson's daughter was undergoing some testing and since then, her daughter has had surgery. Dr. Johnson stated that these are difficult situations that everyone is facing; however, she wished that people would not make public attacks and asked everyone to keep in mind the personal illnesses and losses that some people are experiencing at this time.

Janet Chin talked about the students that were featured in the local newspaper this morning for Rosemead's Arbor Day and its designation as "Tree-City USA". Ms. Chin talked about an article regarding big challenges in learning and technology which change the landscape in our schools, noting that "while changes can take a long time to occur, teachers should be allowed to make choices."

Bob Bruesch acknowledged the presence of City of Rosemead Mayor Sandra Armenta. He thanked her for the impressive Arbor Day celebration with the workers and students planting trees at Willard School. Mr. Bruesch spoke about Monterey Vista's Song Fest and activities taking place to solve math problems with rewards in written bank checks. Mr. Bruesch asked for recognition of teachers for their creative ways of teaching.

John Yuen commented on the open house activities at the Science Lab in Garvey Intermediate School. The parents asked a lot of questions and the session was very interactive.

Tony Ramos read aloud a statement thanking everyone for attending the Board meeting and voicing their concerns. He asked that people honor the five-minute time limit in a fair and equal manner for all those are speaking tonight; to keep in mind the challenging times ahead for Garvey; and to work together in win-win situations.

Mr. Ramos congratulated Rene Hernandez and his staff for the Title I Achieving Awarded to Sanchez School. He thanked Rosemead Mayor Sandra Armenta for being a partner in the Garvey Beautification Day next Saturday.

Dr. Sandra Johnson explained the city's beautification efforts and how Rosemead City staff has been working with the District to prepare the ground and deliver many plants donated to our schools. She thanked City Manager Jeff Allred and his staff for making this possible for our children.

REPORT FROM UNION REPRESENTATIVES

- **Garvey Education Association (GEA)**

Michael Drange, president of GEA, distributed and read aloud the GEA Report relating to caps in teacher benefits and how some teachers are being asked to pay for higher out-of-pocket costs. Mr. Drange talked about the number of positions being reduced and whether or not it included one nursing position. He asked that people look at the GEA website to see GEA's position on the budget situation. Mr. Drange stated that GEA has been asking for collaboration that is not happening. He stated that hiring the superintendent was a mistake and that the environment now is one of isolation and distrust. Mr. Drange stated that he has been trying to foster communication but right now parents and teachers are pinned against each other and GEA lawyers against District's counsel causing additional legal costs. Mr. Drange talked about concerns with the Superintendent-Parent Advisory Council and the decisions made at Garvey Intermediate School about honors classes.

- **California School Employees Association (CSEA)**

Vickie Walker, president of CSEA, Chapter 292, indicated that CSEA's concerns are similar to GEA. Ms. Walker stated that Interest-Based Bargaining is a win-win effort, and she asked everyone to not be misled regarding the facts and comments presented tonight. Ms. Walker stated that the CSEA contract is just now being sunshined to the members and a vote will be taken next week. She urged the District to

negotiate the contract for 2011-12 and stated that the CSEA bargaining team is now in place. Ms. Walker indicated that there has been no discussion on the planned CSEA layoffs.

REPORT FROM HEAD START REPRESENTATIVE

Cindy Carter-Bedoya, Director of Child Development Office, addressed the Board regarding the results of the self-assessment and the Cost of Living Adjustments (COLA) application that was submitted to the L.A. County Office of Education (LACOE).

Ms. Carter-Bedoya indicated that the self-assessment covered health, disability, ERSEA, family, community participation, and program design of mental health and education. The self-assessment reported two items that were non-complaint. One item related to the need to install mesh fencing at Willard School and the use of mesh and privacy fencing for all ten preschool centers. An application has been submitted to help cover the costs of these improvements. The other non-compliant item the need to have a professional development plan linked to the annual needs. Ms. Carter-Bedoya is working with Generao Alarcon to address the corrective action for this non-compliant item.

Ms. Carter-Bedoya talked about the application that was submitted yesterday to fund COLA adjustment and the short turn-around for Board and PC approval. The application for the COLA adjustments is to cover the rising costs of health benefits for a total of \$28,952 that will be used to offset the cost for next year.

REPORTS FROM DISTRICT REPRESENTATIVES

- **Garvey Council PTA**

Cathie Camacho stated that the Council is still in need of an executive Board in order to operate, rather than having to look for membership outside the council. An emergency meeting is scheduled on May 7, 2012, and she is hoping for representation from all units. Anyone interested in serving the Council may contact Ms. Camacho at Sanchez or through the Superintendent's Office.

- **Garvey Education Foundation**

Bob Bruesch indicated there were nine min-grants of \$600 each that were given out. He asked that more teachers think about applying for these grants next year. The Foundation dinner is scheduled next week with about 40 seats still left open. The Foundation will be honoring former students of the District, Rosemead Ex-Mayor Steven Ly, and San Gabriel Mayor Kevin Sawkins, as well as, retiree Dr. Cheng-ou Chang, for his 26 years of service to the district.

HEARING OF PERSONS IN THE AUDIENCE

On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by Janet Chin, and carried by a vote of 4 to 0, Henry Lo not present for the vote, the Board waived the Board Bylaws and allowed to hear all thirteen speakers.

Nancy Eng, parent of 4th grade student, addressed the Board regarding comments made at the last Board meeting. She stated that mis-information and political spins were being made and the children had to witness this. Ms. Eng indicated that she provided input as part of the Superintendent's search committee to select the Superintendent who was hired on a unanimous vote by Board. Ms. Eng commented that in spite of the dire state of educational funding, the children in the District need quality education.

Ms. Eng indicated that she has heard complaints and frustrations from teachers who are concerned about having to re-teach some grade-level lessons. She stated that a comment was made to her from a retired Mark Keppel teacher who felt that the Garvey students were going on to high school unprepared. Ms. Eng stated she is grateful for her son education but not all children are afforded the same opportunity. She stated that as taxpayers and parents, there are many who share her concerns about students' morale, the safety of children, having skilled administrators and teachers in the District, the budget needs, and the District getting out of program improvement

which requires practical solutions. Ms. Eng urged everyone to dialogue in good faith and be objective with transparency in problem-solving solutions throughout the District.

Louis Nogali yielded his time to speak for Ms. Eng to complete her comments.

Karen Bascetta addressed the Board regarding Dewey Student Justin Phan, 3rd place winner of the Spelling Bee competition at the County level. Ms. Bascetta indicated that as a long-time student and teacher at the Garvey School District, she feels bad seeing the District torn apart by the comments made at Board meetings. Ms. Bascetta spoke about her husband's passing a year ago who was also a teacher in the District. Mrs. Bascetta thanked everyone for the most loving and heart-felt letters, cards, and notes. She indicated that Mr. Bascetta taught at the District for 30 years and he left a legacy here at the District.

Pat Kasababian addressed the Board about transparency and the procedure for timing each speaker. She indicated that she hears the opposite about Garvey students hearing they are leaders at Mark Keppel and San Gabriel High Schools. Ms. Kasababian stated that not all students are to be taught as "cookie-cutters". She asked if parents were being told at the Superintendent-Parent Advisory Council about the great gains in our District. Ms. Kasababian handed out a comparison of test scores from the middle schools in the area. She spoke against change being imposed on teachers and students.

Jennifer Ho, student at Garvey Intermediate School, addressed the Board regarding the reduction of Language Arts classes from two periods to one and adding extra time for electives such as Spanish and Mandarin. Ms. Ho stated these language courses are more appropriate for high school than middle school. Ms. Ho noted that reducing the Language Arts classes is a mistake and she asked the Board to re-consider this decision.

Ted Saulino stated that yielding one speaker's time to another has never been a Board policy before. He handed out information regarding comments made on the M. Janet Chin Foundation Facebook page. Ms. Saulino asked for evidence of a \$25,000 contribution to the District. He talked about the after-school program by the M. Janet Chin Foundation using school facilities as listed in the recruitment flyer and the hours listed in the Facilities Use application.

Janet Chin requested to have an item on the next Board agenda to address the Foundation.

Terry Skotness, executive director of the California Teachers Association, addressed the Board regarding Reductions-in-Force (RIF's) stating these were unnecessary terminations. He called these actions wrong and asked the Board to rescind the layoffs before the hearing next week. Mr. Skotness stated that the District has reserves to pay for these laid off positions.

Mr. Skotness asked for everyone's support in signing a petition to get more funding for our schools at the November, 2012 election.

Janet Chin reminded everyone that the Board has passed a resolution in support of state funding for our schools.

Guadalupe Quemada addressed the Board regarding having to deal with the everyday reality of cuts for her and other families and how her husband is working two jobs to take care of her four children.

Raquel Galan addressed the Board regarding the Willard School principal position being reduced. She stated that a non-staff member came to a classroom to record and interview students in class. Ms. Galan spoke about the 36 years that she has been in the District and how the demographics have changed. In regards to comments made about change, Ms. Galan said these are insults to Virginian Peterson and Anita Chu who worked hard for many years. Ms. Galan stated that she is made to read a book, *Standards to Success*, and that communication between staff and administration is "top-down." Ms. Galan noted the many Willard students who have qualified for GATE.

Pat Molina, parent, former student, and teacher at Garvey Intermediate School addressed the Board regarding the elimination of the block schedule for Language Arts. She stated that teachers from Alhambra Unified School often compliment the Garvey students coming to high school better prepared. Ms. Molina commented on allowing the children and teachers to be set up for failure when reading and writing are critical for success. Ms. Molina asked Board members to be knowledgeable about the teachers' input on this matter and she asked that the District work together on these decisions. Ms. Molina discussed a recent meeting she attended at the Superintendent-Parent Advisory Council; she was told that it was not appropriate for her to attend and was turned away.

Alayna Sato addressed the Board regarding a recent Vertical Team meeting involving teachers from Garvey and San Gabriel High School. She read aloud a letter of concern about the highly successful block schedule for English Language Arts, recommending that the Board re-consider this decision.

Edward Lopez addressed the Board regarding his concern of possibly having principals and teachers rotating throughout the District. Mr. Lopez indicated that he has a son with learning disabilities and that the teachers and the principal at Monterey Vista School have been very supportive of his son's education. Mr. Lopez stated that it feels like a break-up of a family when the teachers and principal build bonds with each other, with students, and the community. Mr. Lopez urged the Board to not break up the families in our schools.

Mr. Ramos asked Mr. Lopez to contact the Superintendent to explain the District's policy on teacher transfers.

Christopher Spitler addressed the Board regarding preparation periods and having teachers multiple responsibilities from different commitments in committee work, IEPs, and the valuable loss of one to one face time with students causing burn-out to teachers and students. He spoke of the additional duties given to classified staff. Mr. Spitler stated that Board would not offer teachers a choice in the matter, and he hopes for a change in position for effective change to occur and ensuring truly a quality education.

On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by Tony Ramos, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board voted to waive the Board Bylaws and extend the meeting to 11:30 p.m.

On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by Tony Ramos, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board voted to waive the Board Bylaws and allowed all speakers who turned in their requests to speak after the Board meeting started.

Rosemead Mayor Sandra Armenta addressed the Board regarding Arbor Day and the City of Rosemead being recognized as a Tree City, a great thing for schools in the City of Rosemead. Ms. Armenta thanked Bob Bruesch for his attending today's ceremony at Willard School. Students were able to receive a seed sampling and everyone there enjoyed the ceremony. Ms. Armenta spoke about the upcoming Garvey partnership with Rosemead on this Saturday's Beautification Day. She invited everyone to participate. Ms. Armenta thanked everyone who attended and supported her at the recent City Council Re-organization meeting.

Rosemead Mayor Sandra Armenta spoke as a Garvey employee and on behalf of the teachers and staff at Willard School who fear for their positions. She listed the many accomplishments since Michelle Collaso became principal of the school. Ms. Armenta read a letter from a parent about an incident that happened at a school on March 29, 2012, when a stranger arrived to the classrooms and took pictures asking for names of children and asking questions using an audio recorder. On that day, teachers were in training and there were substitute teachers there. Ms. Armenta's concern was about safety of the children. Ms. Armenta expressed sadness that the District families are torn apart. She talked about the use of Temple's classroom 201 for after-school activities by the M. Janet Chin Foundation saying it was inappropriately being used.

Juan Manuel Vaca addressed the Board regarding decisions made about his son who attends Garvey Intermediate School. He stated this there was gross incompetence, possible negligence and professional misconduct which is causing a loss of valuable instructional days when his son should have been in the classroom setting. Mr. Vaca

asked for a formal review of several teachers and administrators involved in his son's education and transfer decision(s).

The Board reconvened in public at 9:35 p.m.

Ted Saulino addressed the Board regarding the Minutes of March 29, 2012, noting Janet Chin's absence due to school business to attend the Young Elected Officials Network (YEON). He indicated that this practice opens the door for Board members getting a stipend dually.

Janet Chin clarified that minutes reflect previous discussions by the Board, and she represented the District at the YEON, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, where school policy is discussed. Ms. Chin indicated that she will be donating her stipend to the District.

Bob Bruesch indicated that placing the reason for the absence does not need to be said unless the person who is absent wants it noted. The specific reason for Ms. Chin's absence was not mentioned at the last Board meeting. Mr. Bruesch suggested omitting the reason for the absence from the minutes.

John Yuen agreed that the Board member who is absent has the right to decide whether or not to be noted in the minutes. Mr. Yuen asked for a change in the minutes regarding his comments about continuation of the Woodcraft Rangers services (page 7, last paragraph) to read that he supports the afterschool programs run by an "outside agency."

Approval of the minutes was postponed to the next meeting.

- D. Instructional Services**
1. Parent Institute for Quality Education for Parent Involvement at Emerson 10
It was recommended that the Board of Education approve the contract with the Parent Institute for Quality Education for Parent Involvement at Emerson Elementary School from April 18 through June 12, 2012, for 90 parent graduates at an estimated cost of \$8,000.00; to be paid from Title I Program funds. Approved.
 2. Astro Camp – Rice School 11
It was recommended that the Board of Education approve the attendance of thirty-three fifth and sixth grade GATE students, one teacher, and two parents from Eldridge Rice Elementary School, at Astro Camp Guided Discoveries from May 7-9, 2012. Approved.

Reports and Information Items

- A. Report from Greg Isom, Isom Advisors, a Division of Urban Futures, Inc. regarding the feasibility of exploring a bond election. Dr. Sandra Johnson indicated that Mr. Isom was highly recommended by other superintendents in the El Monte and Whittier from among other advisors. 14

Greg Isom addressed the Board regarding a Statement of Qualifications and Funding Option Analysis for the District. He spoke about the past bond successes of the company and the services provided for bond pre-election planning, election services, and financial advice. Mr. Isom presented options for the District based on the District's bond and assessed value history. The options related to General Obligation (G.O.) Bond proceeds, G.O. Bond tax rate extension, and general fund relief through deferred maintenance, buses, portable classroom leases, utility fixtures, furniture/equipment, paying off COP debt, energy costs through "Green" improvements, technology projects, and applicable salaries. Mr. Isom noted the District's voter demographics, voter turnout, and a timeline necessary for a November 2012 bond election.

Board members discussed whether or not this was a good time for voters to approve a bond election and asked about the costs involved. They are interested in knowing if they asked if our neighboring district, Alhambra Unified District, would also be interested in having a joint election.

Action Items

- A. On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by Henry Lo, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board adopted Resolution No. 11-12-15 declaring indefinite salaries for all certificated management, classified management, confidential management, including the Superintendent, and other unrepresented employees' salaries for 2012-2013. 15
- B. It was recommended that the Board of Education consider approving the feasibility of exploring funding options for modernizing, constructing, renovating, and improving classrooms and school facilities in the Garvey School District and contract with Greg Isom at Isom Advisors for this purpose. Item postponed, not approved. 16
- C. It was recommended that the Board of Education approve the revised job descriptions for: 17
School Community Coordinator- Bilingual -Spanish
School Community Coordinator- Bilingual - Cantonese, Mandarin, and Vietnamese

Marie Alexandre, labor relations representative, CSEA Chapter 292, and Vickie Walker, president of CSEA Chapter 292, addressed the Board asking to pull this item for discussion. Ms. Walker handed out information to the Board about negotiating classified positions and the effects that this job description has on employee bumping rights by having the language requirements of Spanish, Mandarin, Cantonese, or Vietnamese. She encouraged four separate job descriptions rather than two one job descriptions.

Genaro Alarcon explained that the current job description has not had any changes since it was approved in 1998. We thought it was a good time to update the job description. These job descriptions, as presented tonight, are what best meets the needs of the District. Dr. Mary Suzuki added that since this job is funded with categorical funds, we have to make sure that duties are in compliance.

Bob Bruesch talked about the differences in definitions for interpreters and translators who may need to be certified. Henry Lo asked about whether realistically the four languages would serve all the needs of the district and if there has been a survey to justify the different languages.

On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by Tony Ramos, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board voted to table discussion of this item.

- D.** On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by John Yuen, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board ratified the contract with AT&T to provide anywhere-wireless connectivity at both intermediate schools, beginning July 1, 2012, and ending June 30, 2014. 18
- E.** On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by John Yuen, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board ratified the contract with Fujitsu to install and configure a VDI infrastructure in the 2012-13 school year. 19
- F.** It was recommended that the Board of Education ratify a contract with Charter Cable to continue providing district-wide fiber optic local/wide area network and T1-based PRI services, beginning July 1, 2012, and ending June 30, 2017. 20

On a concern from Tony Ramos regarding the five-year contract, David Jung explained the E-rate competing process indicating that prices for Charter Cable and Time Warner Cable are very similar. The district is currently using Charter Cable and the service has been satisfactory in recent years.

The Board discussed options about having some cable free drops for cable companies. Mr. Jung explained that one company would not cover free drops for the District office.

The Board approved tabling this item.

- G.** On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by John Yuen, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board ratified the contract with IONet to upgrade the District's network infrastructure, add/replace network drops and set up a centralized video-on-demand system in the 2012-13 school year. 21
- H.** On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by Henry Lo, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board ratified the recommendation to ratify the contract with Standard Tel Networks (STN) to maintain the Mitel voice over IP (VOIP) phone system. The contract term is July 1, 2012 – June 30, 2013. 22
- I.** On the motion of John Yuen, seconded by Bob Bruesch, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board ratified the contract with Vector Resources to maintain the District's network from July 1, 2012 – June 30, 2013. 23
- J.** On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by John Yuen, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board ratified the contract with SharpSchool to continue hosting the District's website from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013. 24
- K.** It was recommended that the Board of Education approve revised fees for Facility Use effective July 1, 2012. 25

Bob Bruesch asked to table this item adding to the cost for Facility Use a cola of living adjustment (COLA).

Ted Saulino addressed the Board in support of the increase in fees for Facility Use, and he expressed a concern that a discussion has not been held with the District's renters regarding an increase on their rates.

Tony Ramos and Bob Bruesch spoke in support of involving the renters in the discussion as part of the school community and adding to the Facilities Use Agreement a clause about responsibility for cleaning up the gymnasiums and the facilities being rented. John Yuen also asked to consider the impact that the COLA will have on some of the organizations who contribute to the District but may not be able to survive in order to provide the service due to the rental increase.

Approval of this item was tabled.

PUBLIC AGENDA ITEMS

Janet Chin asked for a public agenda item regarding the Youth Leadership Center and the M. Janet Chin Foundation.

FUTURE MEETINGS

Janet Chin indicated that the Red Cross has asked to use the Gymnasiums for emergency evacuations in case there is a disaster in our community. Bob Bruesch asked for information regarding today's lock-down at Emerson School.
