Community

The Moreno Valley Unified School District services students from both Moreno Valley and neighboring communities, from a wide range of socio-economic and cultural backgrounds. The district consists of 4 comprehensive high schools, 5 alternative high school programs, 6 middle schools and 23 elementary schools.

School

Canyon Springs High School is a WASC (Western Association of Schools and Colleges) accredited, public high school with an enrollment of 2316 students, grades 9-12. It is a semester based school on a modified traditional calendar. The ethnic breakdown is as follows: Hispanic 63.75%, African-American 16.22%, White, non-Hispanic 13.44%, Asian 2.78%, Filipino/Pacific Islander 3.1%, Native American 0.52%. Estimated 45% 1st generation college-bound.

Curriculum

Canyon Springs has a traditional schedule of 6 class periods per day, 58 minutes per period. Programs such as AVID and 3 California Partnership Academies (Academy of Creative Technology, Health Careers Academy and Business Academy) are offered to all grade levels. Canyon Springs is in the first year of implementation and the only high school in the Moreno Valley Unified School District to offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program.
