## Math Checklist – Q1 Kindergarten

### Numbers and Operations

- \_\_\_ can count orally by ones to 19. (K.CC.1)
- \_\_\_ can count forward to 10 starting from numbers other than 1. (K.CC.2)
- \_\_\_ can read and write numbers from 0 to 10. (K.CC.3)
- \_\_\_ can represent up to 10 objects with a written numeral. (K.CC.3)
- \_\_\_ can say the number names in order when counting objects (K.CC.4a)
- \_\_\_ can understand that the number of objects is the same regardless of their arrangement. (K.CC.4b)
- \_\_\_ can understand that each successive number name refers to a quantity that is one larger. (K.CC.4c)
- \_\_\_ can count arranged and scattered sets of up to 10 objects. (K.CC.5)
- \_\_\_ can compare the number objects in two groups using the terms more, fewer, and same. (K.CC.6)

### Operations and Algebraic Thinking

- \_\_\_ can represent unknown addition and subtraction situations within 5 using objects, fingers, drawings, or acting out. (K.OA.1)
- \_\_\_ can solve unknown number stories involving addition and subtraction within 5 using direct modeling with fingers, counters, pictures, or acting out. (K.OA.2)
- \_\_\_ can add and subtract within 5 using objects, drawings, or other concrete strategies. (K.OA.2)
- \_\_\_ can decompose numbers less than or equal to 10 into pairs in more than one way in the context of manipulatives, dot patterns, and ten frames. (K.OA.3)

### Measurement and Data

- \_\_\_ can compare objects by length using the terms longer and shorter. (K.MD.2)
- \_\_\_ can sort objects into categories using attributes such as color or shape. (K.MD.3)

### Geometry

- \_\_\_ can understand some positional terms. (K.G.1)
- \_\_\_ can identify triangles, circles, and rectangles/squares in different sizes and orientations. (K.G.2)
- \_\_\_ can describe the numbers of sides and vertices of triangles, circles, and rectangles (including squares) in different sizes and orientations. (K.G.4)
