Reminders from the Health Room

Now is the time to schedule those summer doctor appointments for your children.

If your child requires a prescription or over the counter (OTC) medication during the school day, authorizations signed by the doctor and a parent must be provided with the medication before the start of school (link to the form is below). Prescription medication must be in the original packaging that includes a prescription label with your child's name on it. Expired medication cannot be accepted. The school cannot administer over the counter medications for such things as a headache, allergies, a fever, a sore throat, menstrual cramps, stomach aches, etc. unless the authorization and medication has been provided to the health room.

All up-to-date immunization records are also required by the first day of school. Sixth graders are required to receive a Tdap immunization for entry after the student turns 11.

Smart Tuition

If you have had a change of address during the 2017-2018 school year, or if there has been a change in the account name, you must notify SMART of the change so you will receive your billing statement each month in the mail for the 2018-2019 school year.

Also, if you use online Bill Pay for paying tuition through your bank or credit union, you will need to update your account information in June to reflect the 2018-2019 school year, so the check sent by your financial institution will be credited to the appropriate school year (the new school year starts with your July 10th payment).

We know there are probably others that assisted in this holy day; our sincerest thank you.




