Required Components for a Comprehensive School Safety Plan

A copy of the Comprehensive School Safety Plan is available for public inspection at the Galt Joint Union High School District Office. A Public Inspection Log will be used to record the name, address, phone number and method used for verifying the identity of all individuals requesting to inspect the plan. Tactical information is excluded from the public inspection document. This document is not available for inspection on the internet.

(b) (1) Plan is written and developed by a school site council (SSC).	
(2) The school site council may delegate this responsibility to a safety committee made up of a principal/designee, teacher, parent of child who attends the school, classified employee, and others, if desired	X
(b) (3) SSC/planning committee consulted with a representative from a law enforcement agency in the writing and development of the comprehensive school safety plan.	X

(a) The comprehensive school safety plan includes, but is not limited to all of the following:	X
(1) An assessment of the current status of school crime at the school and at school-related functions. (d) Evaluate and amend the plan as needed and at least once each year, to ensure the plan is properly implemented. Also keep an updated file of all safety-related plans and materials readily available for inspection by the public.	X

Plan may include procedures for responding to the release of a pesticide or other toxic substance from properties located within one-quarter mile of a school.	X
