The Rosh Beit Midrash is a full-time, twelve month position responsible for fostering an environment of תורה ומוסר and תלמוד תורה throughout the school's three divisions, and for educating the community at large as to the ideals of sophisticated passionate Modern Orthodoxy and תורה ומדע ideology.

### **About Us**

Kohelet Yeshiva is a warm and embracing Modern Orthodox K-12 yeshiva day school committed to cultivating Bnei and Bnot Torah who think critically and creatively while exuding confidence and compassion.

The Elementary and Middle School Divisions, known as Kohelet Yeshiva Lab School and Kohelet Yeshiva Middle School, are committed to utilizing replicable, empirically supported, student-centered methods of pedagogy in order to maximize learning for all students in both Judaic and General Studies and advance the field of Jewish Education.

The High School division, known as Kohelet Yeshiva High School, builds on these foundations by nurturing the talents and potential of every student while equipping them with the skills and knowledge they will need to succeed and to lead in the best yeshivot and seminaries, the finest colleges and universities, and well beyond.

### **The Position**

Duties and responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

1. Serve as *posek* for the school on day-to-day matters of halakha.
2. Communicate a religious vision inside the school and beyond that is clear, inspiring, and consistent with the school's mission.
3. Serve as a personal role model for learning and religious growth
4. Teach one high school Gemara shiur and co-teach the 11th grade Tikvah Course (combined AP English and Jewish Philosophy) together with the Chair of the English Department.

5. Offers stimulating learning opportunities to Kohelet faculty in both Judaic and General Studies
6. Lead Tefillah daily in the school's main Beit Midrash
7. Organize the high school's weekly Friday Parshat HaShavuah shiur.
8. Organize and officiate at school-run tefillot for Yamim Noraim, Simchat Torah, Shabbatot Shel Ruach, Scholar In Residence Shabbatot, Yom Zikaron / Yom Ha'atzmaut, as well as student Bar and Bat Mitzvah shabbatot. Arrange for child-care and youth programming where appropriate.
9. Oversee various *matmidim* programs to encourage students to continue their Torah learning outside of class.
10. Oversee and advise school Torah publications.
11. Serve as a member of the school's advancement team.
12. Offer regular shiurim, lectures, panel discussions, movie screenings, and other stimulating adult education events in areas of interest to the community.
13. Engage and lead a lay Beit Midrash Committee so as to get insight and feedback into Beit Midrash programming.

The successful candidate will have:

- Semicha from RIETS or a semicha program of similar caliber
- Several years of yeshiva study in addition to semicha
- A Masters Degree or PhD
- Experience teaching teens and adults
- Ability to relate to diverse populations
- Excellent organizational and people skills
