ALL reserves the right to substitute instructors, change course location, limit enrollment, or cancel classes. Classes start promptly, please arrive on time, and sign in students with an instructor. Parents MUST pick up children and sign them out promptly after classes. The Academy for Lifelong Learning staff and instructors are not responsible for supervising children before or after classes.

WAIT LIST PROCEDURES: If a class is full, your name will be placed on a wait list in the order received. You will be contacted if a space becomes available. Once contacted, payment for registration must be received by the end of the next workday.

SUMMER CANCELLATION AND REFUND POLICY: Students may cancel an enrollment without penalty no later than seven working days before the course's first meeting. After that date, no refund or credit will be given. After a course begins, no refund or credit is permitted. Refunds or credits will not be given to students who are absent from all or part of a class, or for classes canceled due to inclement weather or other emergency situations.
