Hazard Mitigation Plan Public Meeting on December 11, 2018

The City of San Angelo and Tom Green County will hold a public meeting on Tuesday, December 11th to gather public input for a Hazard Mitigation Plan. The meeting is at 6:00 p.m. at the San Angelo City Council Chambers (in the McNease Convention Center), 501 Rio Concho Dr., San Angelo, TX. The public is invited and encouraged to attend the meeting.

The purpose of the public meeting is to provide a project overview from H₂O Partners, Inc., consultant to the project, and solicit information from citizens. Public input will help the project team to identify and analyze potential natural hazards affecting residents and recommend possible actions to reduce their impact. Hazards can include floods, tornadoes, wildfires, winter storms, and other major disasters.

The goal of the Hazard Mitigation Plan is to minimize or eliminate the long-term risk to human life and property from known hazards by identifying and implementing cost-effective mitigation actions. Mitigation is defined by the Federal Emergency Management Agency as sustained actions taken to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and property from hazards and their effects.
