Categories of Opportunities

There are three categories of opportunities that Hackettstown Middle School provides to students based on their needs and interests:

1. TI-GERS Clubs

Talented Identification-Growth and Enrichment through Resource Sharing Clubs

The TI-GER clubs are funded and approved by the Board of Education; however, refunded by PTA grants. These clubs are student interest-based to provide enrichment opportunities for students before and/or after the regular school hours. Some of the events for the TI-GERS Clubs may occur during the regular school day.

2. Co-Curricular Activities

Co-Curricular activities are in addition to the curriculum provided during the regular school hours. These activities are student interest-based to provide enrichment opportunities for students before and after the regular school hours. Some of the events for the co-curricular activities may occur during the regular school day.

3. Title I Clubs

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) is a Federal legislation to improve student achievement. Our school receives funds to conduct programs to assist our students in meeting the New Jersey Core Curriculum Standards. Hackettstown Middle School is committed to providing quality educational program to all students and through the ESSA Title I funds, we are able to provide students with additional Academic Support Instruction. Students qualify for the various Title I clubs through an analysis of multiple measures (re. State test data, previous and current school years' academic progress, and teacher recommendations). These clubs meet both before and/or after the regular school day and parent notification will be provided for all students who qualify for the Title I Clubs.

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TI-GERS CLUBS

EDUCATIONAL FANTASY FOOTBALL LEAGUE

Explanation/Description

E.F.F.L. club will use Fantasy Football to enhance students' math, geography, technology, problem solving and decision making skills. Students in this club will create and become an owner of a Fantasy Football Team in an Educational Fantasy Football League. Some of the activities students will complete in this club are creating a team, researching a city for their team, analyzing and researching NFL players, creating a Microsoft Excel document to track weekly data, calculate weekly scoring using various mathematical functions, and collaborate with classmates. Each student will also create a multimedia presentation about their team to present to their classmates.

How can students join?

Students can attend the interest meeting and pick up a permission slip.

Expectations of Students:

The students are expected to attend all meetings, bring a positive attitude and have fun.

Meeting Times:

The E.F.F.L. club will meet two times a week on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 7:30-8:00 am. The club will run from September until December.

FUN WITH FILMS

Grades 6-8

Explanation/Description

This club is designed to give students an introduction to the history of film and explore the way that film has developed from the Black Maria to major Hollywood Blockbusters. Students will start with an introduction to silent films and the very first films. We will watch and discuss several classic films and learn interesting facts about them. Students will have the chance to 'try their hand' at filmmaking through the use of several film editing apps.

How can students join?

Students can attend the interest meeting and pick up a permission slip.

Expectations of Students:

Students will be expected to attend meetings and participate in discussions of films. Students may be given the opportunity to create short film clips and will be expected to appropriately utilize technology.

Meetings will alternate between a 30 minute discussion/film history meeting followed by a longer 1.5 hour meeting during which we will watch the film. Short meetings will be 2:40-3:10 and long meetings will be 2:40-4:00 pm.

GeoBEE

Explanation/Description

The GeoBEE Club assists students in HMS in competing and preparing for the the National Geographic GeoBee which includes three levels of competition; school, state, and national. HMS will conduct a GeoBee and name a school champion. The school champion takes a proctored online qualifying test and the top 100 ranked students in each state qualify to represent their school at the state level GeoBee competition. State champions then travel to National Geographic headquarters in Washington, D.C., to compete in the national championship. This club is also designed to foster meaningful friendships in our school. Students will engage in a variety of team building activities such as cooking, games, homework help and community outreach.

How can students join?

Students will be invited to attend an after school interest meeting where they will be able to pick up a permission slip.

Expectations of Students:

Students are expected to attend afterschool sessions and engage in GeoBee study and review games that will enhance their knowledge of Geography.

Hackettstown Middle School is committed to providing quality educational program to all students and through the ESSA Title I funds, we are able to provide students with additional Academic Support Instruction specifically to increase Literacy and Mathematic skills and understanding.

How are students selected?

Students qualify for the various Title I clubs through an analysis of multiple measures (re. State test data, previous and current school years' academic progress, and teacher recommendations). Parent/Guardian notification of requested student participation will be provided by the school in a letter format. Permission from the parent/guardian must be provided prior to the student attending any of the meeting dates.

Note: Students may be exited from the Title I Club with qualifying data, showing improvements on State tests, current school years' academic results, and teacher recommendations.

Expectations of Students:

Students are expected to attend each club during the specific time and day for the full length of time to assist in the academic progress and to further achievement levels.
