Showcase:

Middle School Principal Rob Valente recognized Toni Ann Palmisano for receiving the Melkin Award. He noted that she is truly talented, dedicated, driven, professional and fun. He also said students were honored and lucky to have her. A photo was taken of Toni Ann with Rob Valente, President McStowe and Superintendent Montesano.

High School Principal Robert Berckes spoke about Dr. John Ennis receiving the Exemplary Secondary Teacher of the Year Award. High School Principal Robert Berckes recently had a jeans day for St. Baldricks fundraiser. Spring sports started but were practicing inside. March 13 was the high school Open House. Looking forward the NJSBA Unsung Heroes/Heroines ceremony where Brittany Torres would be the honoree for Secaucus High School. The junior prom will be March 23 and the Science Fair would take place on March 28.

Huber Street Principal Linda Wilhelm spoke on behalf of Clarendon School Principal who was unable to attend the meeting. The Science Fair for 3, 4, 5 grade students took place on March 13 and he thanked the judges. The Science Fair Assembly took place March 14, and the 5th grade students skyped with retired astronauts thanks to Patricia Smeyers on March 15.

Huber Street Principal Linda Wilhelm spoke about Read Across America that took place on March 2 and over 200 family and friends came in to read to the students. March 14 students participated in PI activities. March 20 will be the book fair and 4th grade students would be going to the State House during the week of March 19.

She welcomed her immediately. Ms. Montesano always enjoys visiting Huber Street and loved watching the students run up and hug her. Stated that she was a true “Patriot” and it is rare that someone stays in the same district for their whole career. She wished her all the best.

Ms. Montesano congratulated Mr. Valente on the Tricky Tray and stated that the Middle School PTA members deserved an award for getting that all together with snow days but they pulled it off.

Ms. Montesano spoke of National Walk Out Day on March 14 and that she thought about what to do to share what kind of people from Secaucus are. She received permission from the Board of Education to have the students go to the football field to make a video of hope to share with the students in Florida that recently experienced a school shooting. There were many people to thank, students were remarkable and it was a complete group effort. After it was over she received many emails from students that thanked her for doing this, that teachers and students together came together to make peace. The word “HOPE” was spelled out with the students on the field and it was breathtaking. The picture of the students spelling out “HOPE” was on the front page of the Star Ledger the next day and she was brought to tears. She was proud of all of us. A framed picture of this was sent to Parkland High School in Florida and one for each school in our district. She sent a special thank you to our Police Dept for surrounding our school to keep us safe during the filming.

Asked what part of the current school budget went to security – Business Administrator Grace Yeo would get back to him with the figure. In 2009 he was part of the Safety/Security Committee and they put together ideas and costs for security in the schools. Stated that students brought nationwide attention to security issues. He thinks that more money should be put in the budget for security purposes. Suggested that school district should arm the security officers we have now, suggested using Shared Services.

Board Member Comments-

All board members congratulated all Showcase students and faculty, all said “HOPE” message was well received, and all spoke highly of Linda Wilhelm and wished her well on her upcoming retirement and all would miss her.

Sharon Dellafave and Lou Giele appreciated Tom Troyer and Andrew Conti speaking in Public Forum about their concerns about the safety in our schools. Mr. Giele does not want to arm security guards but would like police officers in the schools.

Motion by Joan Cali, seconded by Ruby Pantoliano, and unanimously adopted by Board Members present to adjourn the regular meeting at 8:32PM.
