During this time, I will be communicating with you via our alert system with updates.

Please do not come to the school. All activities are cancelled including sports,

afterschool programs, prayer services, Sports Photos and the Improv

performances. The Science Fair will be rescheduled for a later date. The Sports

Dinner is cancelled and will be rescheduled. Parent/Teacher Conferences will be

cancelled. We will revisit these events as needed upon our return as I anticipate that

closure dates may be extended. Report cards will be mailed next week and honor roll

certificates given upon our return.

The Gala has been rescheduled for 5/30/2020, but the raffle will still occur as scheduled via social media.

During the children's absence we will continue sanitizing the building. I will be in and out of the office, but I will check email daily. Please feel free to contact me. I will keep you abreast of all news from the Archdiocese and health officials as needed.

This morning I was informed that our Middle States Accreditation will be pushed to the Fall, so the visit will be next school year.

Thank you for your cooperation during this most difficult time for all. Please stay safe and remember to wash your hands and stay away from crowds. During this Lenten Season, let us pray for each other's health and those who have been afflicted by this virus.
