


2019 Summer Reading Challenge

We are trying something new this year for our annual summer reading challenge! Instead of a monthly reading calendar, the Academic Committee is sending home a Bingo grid that can be completed any 24 days of summer vacation. There are 24 reading activities listed in the grid. Students are asked to complete one challenge per day. There will be no “double dipping.” After an activity is completed, your child must color in the grid on the Bingo sheet. Students in Grades 3-5 write the title of the book used for the activity on the back of the Bingo paper on the corresponding grid number. Students in grades K-2 may have adults read to them and should have a parent/guardian write their titles on the back.

Completed Bingo papers must be returned to school no later than Tuesday, September 10th. Only papers completely filled out will be accepted. Students who complete this year’s summer reading challenge will be surprised with...**a special afternoon outing in the fall.**
