## Minutes & Agenda

Kent welcomed the committee and asked the committee to review minutes from the 9/19/2018 meeting. The minutes were approved unanimously. The agenda for the current meeting was reviewed by Kent.

## Review Feedback from 9/26/18 Community Forum

The written responses and feedback was provided to the committee members. They were asked to read the feedback individually, determine feedback that was actionable, and report this out to the group. Kent shared the feedback from the School Board from his presentation to them on 10/8/18. The Board outlined the following areas they wanted the committee to review:

- Strive to develop a better balance between Greenacres MS and Selkirk MS enrollments in 2027 projections
- Work to increase the Evergreen enrollment projection by 2027
- Review the projected enrollments in the “widow’s peak” area in proposed Selkirk boundary
- Ensure efficient busing around Liberty Lake

## Group Discussion of Potential Areas of Revision

In order to increase the enrollment at Evergreen in 2027 and better balance the enrollments at Greenacres and Selkirk in 2027, the committee looked at a currently undeveloped area north of Morningside Heights (Good Samaritan property) as future development was slated for this area. The committee ran a scenario with this area included in Evergreen’s boundary, and noticed that revision would increase Evergreen’s enrollment and reduce Greenacres enrollment in the 2027 projection.

The “widow’s peak” area within the proposed Selkirk boundary was reviewed, and it was determined that this area is zoned for mixed use, and that there is a potential multi-family development located here in the future. The committee decided to keep this area within Selkirk’s proposed boundary.

Kent explained that Proposal #2 and any future proposals would be taken to the district transportation officials to ensure efficiency of busing.

## Determine Board Recommendation

After reviewing the revisions, it was moved and seconded that Proposal #3 include the area north of Morningside Heights within the new Evergreen boundaries. The committee voted unanimously to approve Proposal #3 as the Board recommendation for new middle school boundaries starting in fall 2019.

**Discuss Fall 2019 Student Transition Plan**

Kent reviewed the Board input on 10/8/18 with regard to the student transition plan in the fall of 2019. Each Board member expressed that the transition should include all grade levels (6-8) of students transitioning to their new boundary school in the fall, but that there should be a special provision for limited choice requests (on classroom space availability) for students between the Greenacres and Selkirk boundaries. The current district-approved student choice policy would apply for students in the other four middle schools.

The committee discussed this Board input, and agreed with Board member sentiments on this transition option. Kent will bring this proposal to the Board for action at an upcoming meeting.
