EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

Experience:

Recent experience in working with groups such as youth groups, child centers, or playgrounds and/or experience requiring organizational skills are desirable.

Bilingual desirable.

Education:

Proof of High School Diploma or equivalency. Must be enrolled in a program leading to an Associate degree or higher in early childhood education, child development or related field. Must attend not less than 15 clock hours of professional development per year. CPR and First Aid certificate is required. **Person hired will also be required to submit to a physical examination, be fingerprinted, and complete a child abuse index form.
