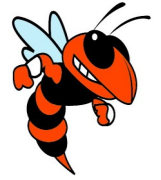

Teacher's Corner

Mr. Sierra Social Skills Newsletter Article

This month the students of Kemp Intermediate Social Skills class have been reviewing their fundamental expectations in school and the specific skills they need to use when dealing with frustrations. During one of our classes, I asked about their expectations that they are responsible for while in school. One of the students raised his hand and answered with, "It is to follow directions, because the teacher is in charge of the classroom and if we don't do what she tells us to do our class will be in total chaos." Another student raised his hand and stated that the second expectation is to do their school work that is assigned and try to do their best to complete it. The third expectation was explained by a student that it is to be respectful and he gave examples of phrases to use like, "Yes Ma'am, No Ma'am, excuse me, please, and thank you" when interacting with adults and peers. When explaining their fourth expectation, which is to control negative behaviors, another student pointed out that in order to control a negative behavior they need to follow specific steps which are:

- 1) Stop! And think of choices
- 2) Pick a choice! (Hopefully the right choice)
- 3) Do it! (Actually do It. Don't just keep the choice inside your head)
- 4) Feel good about yourself (for picking the right choice)

When the class ended, the students got in line, and waited to be released for their daily classes and that is where I noticed all the students seemed confident and ready to face their school day of growing and learning.
