What kind of Chromebook do I need?

We require the **Dell Chromebook 11 3189 Touchscreen**. This model is available in 3 hard drive sizes, 16, 32 or 64 GB. We have tested the 16GB base model and it is sufficient for the Student's needs; however, all three options are acceptable. We highly recommend an Accidental Damage policy for these as well as we do not repair Chromebooks at the school. There are many websites to purchase these devices and all offer different protection plans with them.



Things you need to know..

1. All students must have the same device. This is will give all students access to the same apps, software, and device capabilities for classroom use.
2. In order for us to manage devices, all students must log onto our network when they are at school.
3. It is the student's responsibility to come to school with a charged device ready to work.
4. The teacher has authority over all devices at school
5. The care and security of the device is the student's responsibility.
