

**Troy Independent School District
Report of Violent and Criminal Incidents 2017-2018**

The Texas Education Code requires every district to publish a report on violent and criminal incidents at their schools that is available for use and review by the public in the district. According to TEC §39.306 this report shall include:

- a statement of the number, rate, and type of violent or criminal incidents that occurred on each district campus, to the extent permitted under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. Section 1232g),
- information concerning school violence prevention and violence intervention policies and procedures that the district is using to protect students, and
- the findings that result from evaluations conducted under the Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act of 1994 (20 U.S.C. Section 7101 et seq.)
